Matthew 3:15-17

1. _____ of the Son

Let us understand that the LORD Jesus had no sin for which He needed repentance. Yet, for our sakes, He humbled Himself and fully identified with those who needed to repent that He would be for us a faithful High Priest for our salvation.

Hebrews 2:17 ~ Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people.

2. _____ by the Spirit

Being made like us, Jesus relinquished His authority, though not His nature. Even as we are to do, Jesus submitted to the Father in all things and was led by the Spirit throughout His earthly life.

John 17:19 ~ And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

3. _____ from the Father

There was never a moment that the Son refused or disobeyed His Father. And there is never a moment when the Father lost confidence in the Son. In full union, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, functioned to bring about the redemption of man.

John 3:35 ~ The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand.

Hebrews 2:9

But we see him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

Isaiah 53:12

Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

Philippians 2:8

And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

2 Corinthians 8:9

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich.

1 Corinthians 6:11

And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

2 Thessalonians 2:13

But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth.

John 10:36

John 5:22

For the Father judges no one, but has given all judgment to the Son.

For when he received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."
