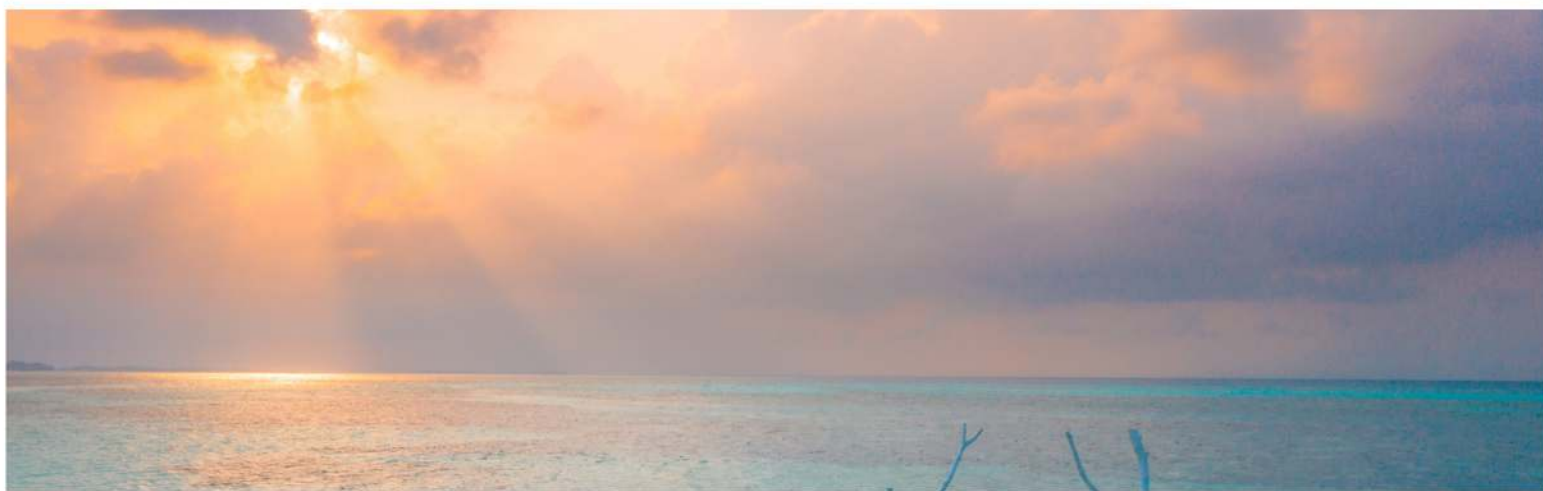

Dear Prayer Warriors,

We were blessed once again this month to have Pastor Munir and his wife Sharon join us at Kehila. He and his wife are serving the Lord in Ramallah, in Ramle and indirectly also in Gaza. It was heartbreaking to hear the reports of believers in Gaza and their struggles. We continue to pray for the people in Gaza as they recover from war and for the believers as well who struggle with life in the Gaza strip.

Jack and Judi had an opportunity to meet with H. in December. H. got our names from believers from the states. While H. is not Jewish, her desire is to share the gospel with Jewish people. She wanted to meet with us to get further direction in how to wisely share the gospel with her Jewish friends in Israel. We were glad to meet with her, and hear her stories of the many Jewish people that she has come into contact with. We were happy to supply her with tracts and help her identify the most effective way to show Jewish people that Yeshua is their Messiah. Please pray for H. as she delivers the gospel to her Jewish friends.

A dear friend of ours who was part of the Kehila here in Rehovot for many years before she moved to Haifa has been diagnosed with a blood disorder that can become life-threatening. Her condition and her outlook is not good. R. is a believer, so she is looking forward to glory, but her trip to glory might be a painful one. Please pray for R. as she travels the road ahead of her. Jack has been very involved with R. and her needs over the years. Please pray he would have wisdom in helping her deal with final issues that will need to be taken care of.

Please pray for T&H. T. is a believer who attends our Kehila and our ladies Bible study, but her husband H. is not a believer. We have prayed for H. since we first met T., but now that prayer is more urgent. H. has aggressive prostate cancer that has spread throughout his body. We have gone to visit T&H several times and had good conversations about the faith. H. is ok with T. being a believer, but he continues to remain stubborn in his heart with the so common excuse of "I'm Jewish. I won't believe in Yeshua." Please pray for T&H and especially that H. would soften his heart before it's too late.

On a recent visit to T&H, Jack had the opportunity to speak with their son, Y. Jack shared the gospel with special emphasis to the purpose of life. The next day, Jack was finished fixing Y.'s laptop. When Y. picked it up, Y. accepted a New Testament from Jack. We're praying he'll read it and his heart and life will be changed.

We were saddened to say goodbye to F. this month. F. lived with us for five months after completing his doctorate. You may recall that you prayed for F. not long ago after he had a severe stroke. He has mostly recovered, but still has a long way to go to be whole. Please pray for F. as he has returned to his home in Ghana. Pray that he will find the fellowship of believers that he needs, and the medical attention for his complete recovery.

Our oldest son had a birthday in December. How strange it is to watch your children grow older and how thankful we are that as he grows older, he continues to walk with the Lord. Please pray for Isaac, that he would stand strong and lead his young family in the ways of the Lord.

Our daughter in law also had a birthday this month. How thankful we are for Joye, the blessing she is in our life and in the life of our youngest son Aaron. Pray for Joye and Aaron as they continue to seek God's will, direction, and timing in their lives.

PASTOR STUART FRASER

Dear FBC Family,

We live in a world that prizes independence. Strength is often measured by self-sufficiency, and success by how little we need anyone else. Our culture celebrates the lone ranger, the self-made individual, the one who goes it alone. Yet from the opening pages of Scripture, God tells a very different story. The Bible consistently reminds us that isolation is not a virtue, and independence is not the goal. We were created for fellowship.

The preacher in Ecclesiastes puts it plainly: “Two are better than one because they have a good return for their labor. For if either of them falls, the one will lift up his companion. But woe to the one who falls when there is not another to lift him up” (Eccl 4:9-10). God knows our weakness, our vulnerability, and our need for one another. Life is filled with moments when we stumble, grow weary, or lose perspective, and God’s design is that we not face them alone.

This truth reaches all the way back to creation itself. In Genesis 1, God repeatedly declares that His work is good. But in Genesis 2:18, we encounter the first “not good” in the Bible: “It is not good for the man to be alone.” Adam lived in a perfect world, walking with God, yet something was missing. God created him with a need for relationship. He made Eve as a helper corresponding to him, showing us that fellowship is not an afterthought but part of God’s original design (Gen 2:18-25). From the beginning, God has been teaching us that we flourish in community.

The book of Proverbs reinforces this wisdom: “He who separates himself seeks his own desire; he quarrels against all sound wisdom” (Prov 18:1). Isolation does not lead to spiritual maturity; it often leads to self-focus and spiritual drift. God wired us to need

encouragement, accountability, and shared joy. We grow best when our lives are intertwined with others who love Christ and walk with us in faith.



This is precisely why God gave us the church. In Christ, we are not merely individuals who happen to worship in the same place; we are brothers and sisters, members of one body (Matt 12:49-50; John 20:17; Rom 12:4-5). The early church “devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and to fellowship” (Acts 2:42), and the result was spiritual vitality, shared joy, and mutual care. The New Testament repeatedly calls us to love one another, bear one another’s burdens, encourage one another, and stir one another up toward love and good works (Gal 6:2; Heb 3:13; 10:24-25). These commands assume proximity, relationship, and belonging.

At its heart, the church is God’s gracious answer to one of our deepest human needs. He has given us a spiritual family where we are known, loved, and supported. Fellowship is not merely something we attend; it is something we participate in. As we gather, serve, pray, and walk together, God uses the church to strengthen our faith and remind us that we belong to Him and to one another.

Let us then resist the temptation to treat the church as a place we attend rather than a family to which we belong. God calls us not merely to sit together, but to walk together, love deeply, and carry one another toward Christ. When we live as true brothers and sisters, the watching world sees not just a gathering, but a redeemed family shaped by the gospel. May God help us to open our lives to one another in meaningful, Christ-centered ways, for His glory and our mutual good.
