**How can someone demonstrate patience with a ruler?**

**Gentle:** soft, tender hearted, one

One of the reasons there are so many fights, arguments, and violence is because people are quick to respond insults and slow to respond with grace and gentleness.

**What valuable lesson does King Solomon teach in this verse?**

**Honey:** Symbol of abundance, blessing, delight, and spiritual sweetness.

God promised Israel numerous times that He would give them a land flowing with milk and honey. Honey sweetened cakes, accompanied curds, and refreshed weary soldiers. Honey was also a food that was dedicated to the Lord. However, we are not to over indulge or idolize its physical delights.

This happens when someone exploits a host's good will and becomes a nuisance. In biblical days, host's were expected to be gracious, generous, and helpful to visitors. However, this verse teaches us that a host will not always enjoy these obligations.
