

Let God Handle It

Ezekiel 34:1-6

What happens when leaders and shepherds consistently cause harm to the flock they are supposed to feed and protect? Sadly, some of our leaders have abused their roles and abandoned their responsibilities, but how should God's people respond? In a portion of his prophetic message, Ezekiel shares a time when God spoke to him concerning the shepherds of Israel, His sheep, and His plan to shepherd them once and for all. How can you use this word to encourage someone who has been hurt by a church leader? Why is this important for the church to know and share?

"The LORD is my shepherd; I have what I need. He lets me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside quiet waters. He renews my life; he leads me along the right paths for his name's sake. Even when I go through the darkest valley, I fear no danger, for you are with me; your rod and your staff they comfort me."-Psalm 23:1-4
