Four Particulars of Biblical Joy

- **Joy Was Promised to God's People (Isaiah 9:2-4)**

- **Joy Was Proclaimed to God's People (Luke 2:8-11)**

- **Joy is Perfected in God's People (John 15:11; Philippians 4:4)**

- **Joy is Made Permanent for God's People (Revelation 21:1-4)**
