

#### Dear OSL Church Members,

Our 2022-2023 academic year is now closed and we give thanks to God for His provisions for grace and mercy throughout the school year. Our teachers finished the year on June 1 after a week of meetings and moving classrooms to be ready for the new school year. Our Preschool-Kindergarten classes will be housed in our ECE buildings with one Preschool class continuing to be housed next to my office in the main building. Our first and second-grade classes will be found in the temporary buildings in the parking lot next to the ECE building and pavilion. We are pleased to have our ancillary classes of art and music and the library return to the pavilion. The 10-classroom building will contain grades 3-8 and our SSC.

This coming year we will be able to serve more students in the Student Success Center. We expanded our offerings so our children on the wait list could receive interventions. We also will offer the Donatus program for our High Ability Learning scholars who need support in Mathematics and English/language arts. We are pleased to have Mrs. Ripple (4th grade) and Mrs. Robison (1st grade) join the SSC team to serve our scholars.

In the summer months, while teachers are home relaxing, they will also be preparing for the new Mathematics textbook series we adopted for the next school year. Our current math textbook series, which we have loved has an end-of-life date and will no longer be published. We have adopted Math-U-See. Our teachers will be preparing their curriculum maps for the school year and have formal training when they return in August. The teachers and administration team also attend professional development conferences in the summer. Our new Donatus teachers will attend training in Depth and Complexity to prepare them to lead the program. All of our teachers will attend a classical education conference including Consortium for Classical Lutheran Education at Concordia University-Nebraska this July or the Memoria Press Teacher Training Conference either in person or virtually in July. Some teachers will attend the summer teacher virtual training conference from Society for Classical Learning in June on our campus.

We are excited to share with you the temporary buildings, and we will schedule an open house for you to see the classrooms ready for the fall. Watch the bulletin for the opportunity to see them open and ready.



#### Dear Fellow Members of OSL Church,

I had the good pleasure to serve as chaperone on the OSL School 8th Grade class trip to our nation's capital the second week of May. Because OSL School is arguably our most significant of the various ministries we support, I wanted to share my observations of these young adults with you so that you would have some measure by which to assess the results of your faithful giving of tithes and offering.

Each of the four days we toured many historically significant sites in Washington, D.C., walking from monument to memorial to memorial to monument, each day logging a minimum of 5 miles and a maximum of about 9 miles. We were on a tight schedule, sharing a large coach bus with two other schools, but OSL has the most students (17). Our tour guide from World Strides, Miss Amy, began each day with prayer and devotion. She engaged our young people by seeking their involvement in leading the devotion, or prayer, or in reading a Bible verse of encouragement. We had the same bus driver for the entire trip, Mr. Dominique. And we had a World Strides liaison at the hotel, Mr. Vern.

Our OSL Eagles were among the most mature group of like-aged people I have ever been around. They treated all others with respect and dignity, even total strangers. I witnessed many of our young people introducing themselves to Military Veterans at the war memorials, and thanking them for their service. Our group also quickly befriended our bus/tourmates from Illinois and El Paso, cultivating friendships that will likely continue.

Most significantly, our OSL soon-to-be graduates let Jesus shine in them, most evident in their kindness, thankfulness, and respectfulness toward each other and all others. Amy and Vern both made it a point to tell me, Mr. Jimmy Eifert (8th Grade Teacher), and Mrs. Danielle Bolen (chaperone) how impressed they were with our group of young people, saying that these were among the very best behaved, most mature, and genuinely fun to be around, group of teenagers they had ever toured (and they've toured thousands over many years).

As a father of one of the 8th Graders, and as a former OSL School Board Chairman, and current OSL Church Elder, I couldn't have been more pleased and thankful. Pleased to see that the OSL School environment is reinforcing our family values centered on Christ Jesus and thankful that my child as well as all the scholars are being shaped to embrace life-long learning, indeed learning how to learn, which is far superior to learning how to take a test.

Lastly, our students would not have born the fruit of kindness, goodness, thankfulness, respectfulness, love, joy, peace, obedience, patience, the ability to get along with others, etc., without the loving sacrifice and continual shaping efforts of our teachers (over the years). When you see our OSL Teachers, please give them an encouraging "thanks" or "good job!" They are clearly doing a phenomenal job and working in partnership with parents, "…like arrows in the hand of a warrior…" to get our children safely and successfully into the adult world where they can be difference makers for Christ Jesus! I believe that our School must continue to be our church's primary ministry and I look forward to participating in the School's Building Expansion project, to meet the growth needs we are experiencing now. It is so very gratifying and praise-worthy to witness or hear of the many OSL School Scholars being baptized in our church. In this, we are walking in obedience to Christ Jesus' Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) to "make Disciples…baptizing them

in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them" to observe all that Christ Jesus commanded the Apostles. I look forward to working with you, my fellow OSL Church members, in helping our School grow wisely so that we can say with confidence that we are doing our part in shaping the next great generation.
