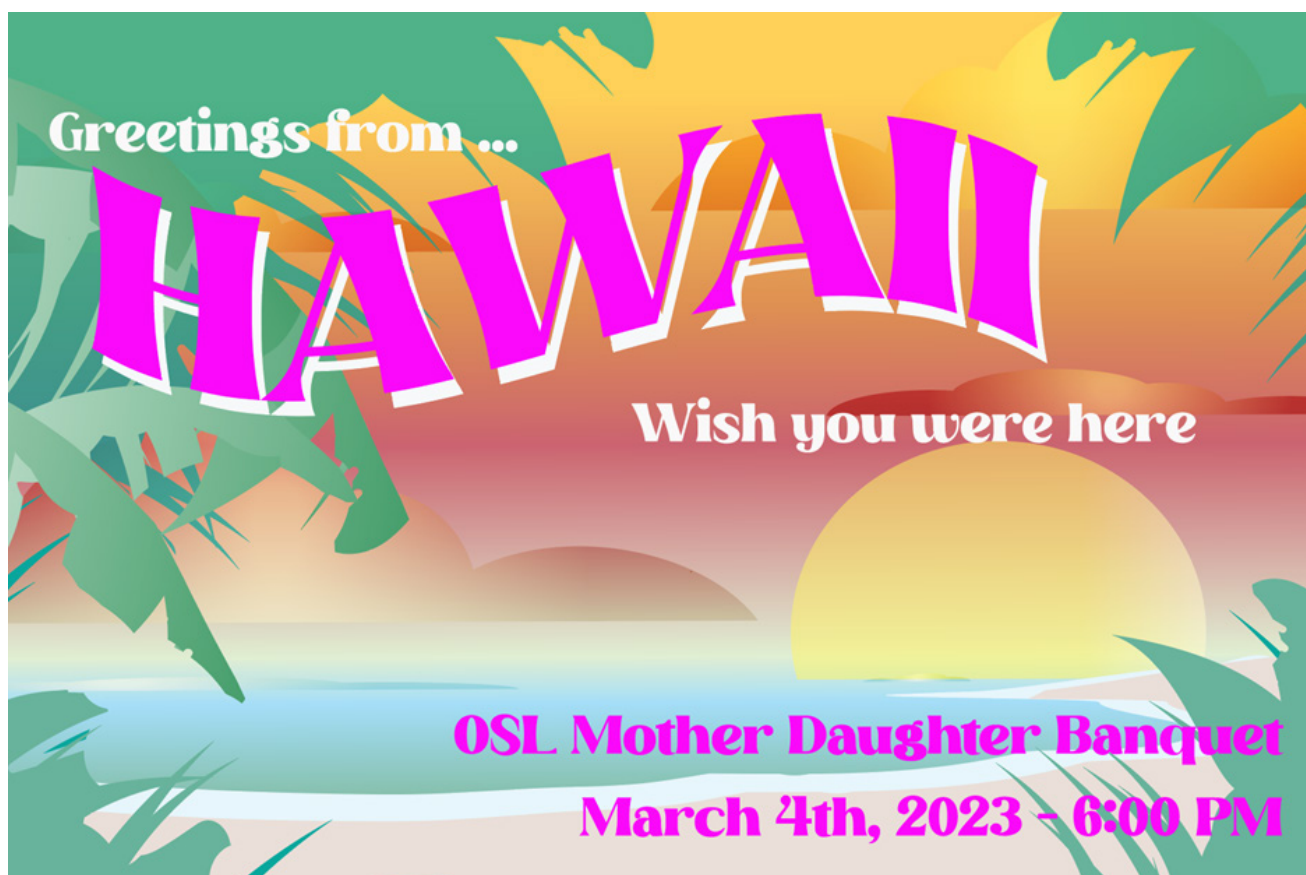

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we continue our look at the Lutheran Confessions, we now turn our attention to the section entitled, *The Power and Primacy of the Pope*.

Even though Philip Melanchthon had been able to sidetrack the acceptance of Luther's Smalcald Articles from formal acceptance, feeling they may be too divisive, the Lutheran representatives at Smalcald recognized the need for more to be said concerning the Papacy. They asked Melanchthon to write this document, intended initially to supplement the Augsburg Confession, which would reveal the heresy of the doctrine of the papacy from Scripture. He completed what we now know as *The Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope* while at Smalcald, where it was signed and accepted by the Lutheran delegates.

Here we begin to see Melanchthon's wavering resolve when it would come to doctrinal matters. Although the *Treatise* takes a firm stand on the errors of the papacy, Melanchthon would later state that he wrote it "more harshly than is my custom." The possibility exists that Melanchthon was compelled to write the *Treatise* more robust than he would have liked, either by the Elector or by the general consensus at Smalcald. Whatever the case, it is evident that his stance against the papacy here went beyond his own personal beliefs, as demonstrated in Melanchthon's conditioned subscription to Luther's *Smalcald Articles*.

As a historical aside, it should be noted that for some time, there was confusion about the authorship of the *Treatise*. In the *Book of Concord*, it was appended to the Smalcald Articles rather than the Augsburg Confession, and it was ascribed to the "Assembled Theologians" at Smalcald rather than Melanchthon. Not until 1770 were documents discovered that showed Melanchthon's authorship.

In *The Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope*, Melanchthon presents three major objections to the papacy. First is that the pope claims the right to set himself above all other bishops and pastors in the Church; second, the pope claims to possess authority in the realms of both Church and state; and third, the pope demands people acknowledge his authority in the Church as a requirement for salvation. Although the positions have changed and been moderated over the years, the claim of papal supremacy above all other Christian pastors is still a closely guarded part of Roman Catholic doctrine.

The Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope is still a tremendous and beneficial resource for us today as we continue to understand our Lutheran doctrine based not on the ideas of men but on the authority of God, revealed to us through His holy Scriptures. I encourage all to read, learn, and inwardly digest this wonderful treasure.

In February we celebrated the 100th Day of School. Kindergarten scholars prepared posterboard with creative ways to present 100 things. Each scholar presented their posterboard to the family and friends who gathered. Our young scholars had a visit from the Houston Grand Opera. The tenor who visited sang the famous picture book *The Snowy Day* by Ezra Jack Keats. Our eighth-grade families hosted a memorable Father/Daughter Dance complete with unicorn ponies and great food and dancing. We had a fun Spirit Week as we cheered our basketball teams to victory at the State tournament. The school dressed in house colors, Sunday best, Valentine's Day colors, as Disney characters, and as cowboys and cowgirls. Raising Cane's also hosted a Spirit Night for our school family. We also hosted a Volunteer Appreciation Breakfast for the wonderful people who help our teachers and scholars.
