



Volunteer Onboarding

- Volunteers will be required to complete the following items in order to participate within the children's ministry:
 - Obtain CFC membership
 - Keep a current background check on file
 - Complete Ministry Safe's Sexual Abuse Awareness Training
 - Review CFC children's ministry policies & training material

Dress Code

- Volunteers will wear similar markers to help parents and children easily identify themselves within the children's ministry.

Drop-Off & Pick-Up

- In order to drop a child off into the care of the Children's Ministry, parents are required to first check-in their child on the CFC check-in system. They will receive a coded name tag for their child and a matching parent sticker for themselves. Volunteers will ensure each child has a name tag as they enter their room and will collect the parent sticker upon pick-up.

Safety

- In an effort to increase accountability and safety, each classroom is equipped with technology as well as standard protocol to protect our volunteers and children.

Food & Snack

- Food & snacks are generally not provided during the service. If there ever is an instance in which food is given, children will not be allowed to eat it until they are back in the care of their family.

Bathroom

- Children may use the restroom during the service as long as they are accompanied by a volunteer. The volunteer will wait outside the restroom until the child finishes and accompany them back to class. Should a child be unable to use the restroom unassisted, a volunteer will page a parent to attend to their child.
