Pastor John's Message

Mutual Aid

We made it. (I know it is only February but last week's epic ice storm was a lot!!!) What a stretch these past weeks have been. Ice. Outages. Cold homes. Kids out of school. Linemen working nonstop. Neighbors checking on neighbors. All of us doing what we could.

And in the middle of it all, something steady and strong showed up again. ***Mutual aid.***

We saw it everywhere.

People meeting linemen from Florida who came to restore power.

A church taking in residents from a nearby assisted-living facility when the heat went out.

Neighbors with chainsaws clearing driveways.

Folks sharing food, batteries, blankets.

This is what good citizens do.

We look out for one another.

We step in when someone is struggling.

We don't wait for permission.

But it's also what Christians do.

Mutual aid isn't just a civic instinct — it's a way of following Jesus.

He taught us to carry one another's burdens.

To feed the hungry.

To welcome the stranger.

To love our neighbor not in theory, but in practice.

We're seeing that same spirit far beyond Tennessee.

In Minneapolis, ordinary people are escorting frightened children into school.

Delivering food.

Showing up when something feels unjust.

Citizenship and discipleship woven together in many reports I am getting from churches in the Twin Cities.

In this issue, you'll see some of the ways our church is offering mutual aid right now. As February begins and we enter Lent, we'll return to the heart of Jesus' teachings — the living, breathing stories that push back against the heaviness of the world and call us to act with courage and compassion.

We are making it. And we're making it together — as neighbors, as citizens, and as followers of Jesus.

Good Intentions gone wrong...

“Everyone’s Favorite Heresies” Beloved, Not a Banner

Pastor John visits examples in history of the tie between the Christian religious faith and political military power, and what we are seeing today in what's being referred to as Christian nationalism and where Christianity is being sought to be essentially the religion of the state, and that things that are done, whether it's policing our own citizenry or being involved militarily with other nations, is increasingly being done in the name of the church, in which the message of Jesus, which is one of compassion, reconciliation, humility and human dignity, gets corrupted, leading many spiritual seekers to reject the church for these reasons.

Reminder: The Session has called a brief Congregational Meeting following our worship service to address changes in the pastor’s terms of call.

February 22

First Sunday in Lent: the good news is...so good it catches us by surprise

John’s Gospel doesn’t begin with a temptation story but instead opens Jesus’ ministry with a wedding miracle. It may feel a bit lavish to start the season of Lent with a wedding banquet, but the good news begins with joy. This week we focus on the subversive and

playful nature of the good news. The kin-dom of heaven is so good it should catch us by surprise! Like a mustard seed, the good news can grow from the smallest seed into the tallest tree. Like an unruly weed, or fine wine saved for last, the good news is abundant and cannot be contained. As we sink into Jesus' teachings throughout the season, we may not always be comfortable, but we can trust that these teachings are good, rooted in love, and worthy of celebration.






Youth

The Grace Table - February Theme: "Safety: Creating a Stable Psychological Container"

The Grace Table is beginning a year-long healing and formation journey for those in recovery or seeking deeper healing and wholeness. Meeting twice a month on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays and gathering around a meal, The Grace Table offers thoughtful teaching, reflective dialogue, and creative, embodied practices that support honesty, emotional regulation, relational repair, and meaningful spiritual growth. This is a slow, grounded space where grace meets real life—no fixing, no performing, just faithful presence around a shared table.

On March 31 from 6:30 to 8:00 PM, EBPC will host a community, panel-led discussion titled *"Generation to Generation: How Parent-Child Relationships Impact Our Lives."* We will explore how many challenges, including substance misuse and mental health concerns, are rooted in our early years and can continue to affect us if they are not fully addressed. 
