### Luke 15: 15-19

*"So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands."'*


**With which son in this story do you best relate?**

- Have you ever been lost and now found?
- Were you adrift splurging away your life and focused only on selfish fulfillment?
- Or have you been steady and faithful, always focused on doing what is right and expected of you?
- Because of this, have you developed an air of self-righteousness?
- Which son has traveled farther from God?
- Does returning from a home built of self-righteousness and self-importance require just as much washing as coming from the pig-pens and dung-heaps of the world?

St. Luke's, the parable of the Prodigal Son provides an ample supply of material for discussion and self-reflection. Regardless of where we find ourselves in life, this story can lead us back into the arms of God. We are very good at drifting and straying.

We may purposely run into the world to indulge in whatever pleasure we seek, or we can slowly slide along in our fog of self-righteousness. Either way, at some point we need to come to our senses. When we do and when we take the necessary steps to set aside our self-centered focus and repent, then we are received in God's open arms. He does not punish or chastise. He does not even take the time to see if the lessons have been learned or that penitence has been paid. **What He does do is celebrate and rejoice!**
