

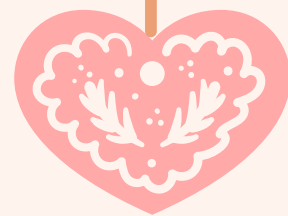

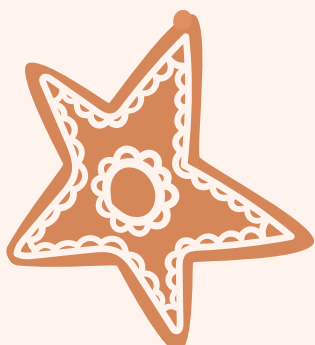

Ways You Can Serve

- **Main Contact** – Oversee the breakfast ministry as a whole and organize the teams.
- **Serve on a Team** – Most teams cook every other month, some once a month. Teams of 6–8 work best.
- **Team Captain** – Send reminders, gather extra help if needed, and lead your team on Sunday.
- **Shop & Order Supplies** – Weekly shopping for eggs, milk, and other essentials, plus keeping us stocked with trays, utensils, water, etc.
- **Panera Pick-Up** – Friday night pickup at the Laurelwood location (arrive just before closing at 9pm), then bring items to the church Sunday morning at 7am.
- **Give Financially** – Support the food ministry fund to help cover ongoing costs.

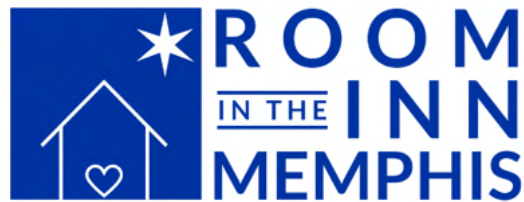
The Fun Bunch
