"Do not be like a horse or a mule, without understanding, whose temper must be curbed with bit and bridle, else it will not stay near you."


St. Luke's are you being led by God?

The Youth are currently at Appalachia Service Project (June 29-July 6). We hope to share pictures after we return and appreciate your prayers and support so very much!


Here's what's on the schedule after we return:

Sunday, July 28/2p - Meet at Jeremiah's for cool treats! (3717 Summer) Bring money and families are welcome!


Sunday School continues to meet every week from 9-10 am in the Youth Room (Thank you, Susan!).

A word to ponder:

Cross Words That Build Up

Normally associated with cross words are statements made that erupt out of mouths in fits of anger occurring when there is a “blowing of one’s top.” These statements are as hot flowing lava consuming the victim/victims with the volcanic ash choking life out of all in ear shot despite their continued breathing.

The cross words I speak of in this reflection do not fit the above usual understanding. They are instead words nested in expressions giving meaningful life and hope to all who hear them. Statements like “You look nice today.” “That was a kind deed I saw you give to a neighbor. It sure did them wonders.” “I am sorry for not being very thoughtful to you the other day. Please forgive me.” “Those were good points you shared at the seminar. Well done.” And a thousand more of like mind and heart expressed.

These cross words emerge when we concentrate on whatever is true; whatever is honorable; whatever is just; whatever is pure; whatever is lovely; and whatever is of good report. Philippians 4:8. It is centering on thinking what is excellent and worthy of praise. Such genuine and affirming kindness in looking for the beautiful are terrific ways to plant hope, birth smiles, warm a heart, put dance in a step, and bring life back quickly or slowly after one feels defeated or dead inside.

To all in the flesh world that delights in horrifically putting neighbor down, watching and listening to this practiced cross word building up is like a crossword puzzle. It’s an momentary event that can lead a bitter spirit to sit down and figure out “just what happened here?” It may be the very moment of kindness expressed and shown that brings them around to building up and not tearing down.

When God’s children share this power of affirming cross words, it is one of the many ways it is living as Jesus a life that is true.
