Now everybody knows that one can't do much, but ne brought a friend last month and then there were two.


Two little church members each one brought one more, now don't you see?

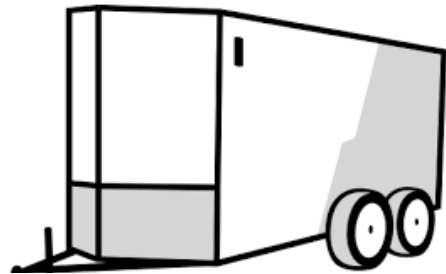

Each year Project Transformation engages over 80 college age adults in ministry and service with more than 700 children in 9 site churches across Tennessee. 99% of children and youth maintain or improve their reading levels over the summer.
