Some three years ago, I was expressing to the pool guy where we were lodging that there was an abundance of poison Ivy that we had to be careful not to touch. His reply was "that's not poison ivy, its a native plant called Virginia Creeper."

To myself I said, "My goodness!" I chose not to tell him that for ten years, trimming shears was a packed item for The Outer Banks vacation to cut to the ground the "poison ivy" wherever we were staying. 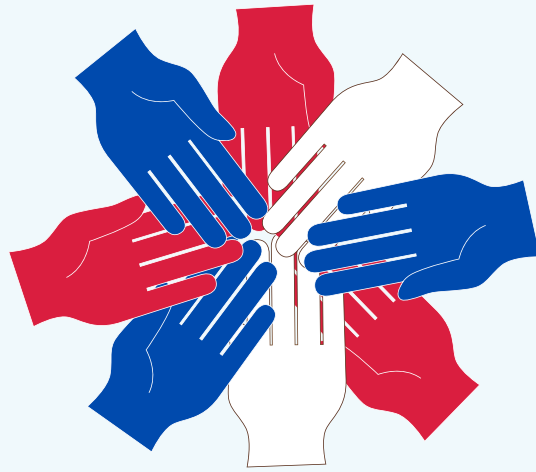

Over the last four years, RITI has sheltered 3,042 individuals through the Congregational Shelter, Recuperative Care, and Family Inn programs. 972 of those sheltered on our campus were children under the age of 18.

With support from the RITI community, 181 households have exited homelessness since April 2021. At Room In The Inn - Memphis, each guest and family brings a story of their own. As we walk alongside those stories, which are often tragic and challenging, they become stories of hope and healing in time. With your help and support, brighter days are made possible through a caring staff and volunteers.

Every winter season St. Luke’s in cooperation with Room In The Inn – Memphis, we provide warm safe shelter for our Memphis homeless. This past winter season we provided shelter, transportation from a downtown site to our church, a warm meal, hot showers, a safe clean bed for the night, breakfast and a snack bag and return transportation back downtown for 36 women and 10 children. We had 70 volunteers that helped with driving, setting up, providing supper, snack bags, overnight Shepards and cleaning up on Sunday mornings.
