NET WORKING and NET MENDING

When Jesus extended the invitation to James and John to be fishers of people, they were mending their nets. This mending was a daily responsibility for all fishermen then and now to keep their nets in tip top order. Sound nets meant opportunity for best catches. They gave a close inspection to check the mesh for tears and wear. When spotted and often it was the case because of daily repeated use the torn and worn areas were immediately repaired.

When they left their fish trade to follow Jesus, they might have thought their mesh inspection days were over. "Oh contraire!" They became aware that this invitation to be fishers of people surely brought joy to many by way of Christ but the cost of the catch was high. In the midst of their networking with Jesus and alongside others of The Way before and after the ascension torn and worn-both literally and figuratively-daily visited them.

Sadly, throughout the life of Jesus and those who joined this Holy Band, there were those who despised the Fishers. The rejection and affliction based on grounds that none of them were truly "keepers." The likes of them? Never! Consequently, in response to this bitterness Net Mending to remain sound was an everyday must for them.

As essential as it is for sound Net Working, it seems to me that The Church down through the ages has not taken up this critical practice. I do not think it's been either intentional or dismissed as unimportant. Simply put, I think it's been quite innocently overlooked.

The mending is read but in my estimation the meaning of it has gone unnoticed. As the expression goes "off the radar."

Here at St. Luke's, we have an opportunity to reinstitute Net Mending. To be clear this invitation to see where we are torn and worn in no way suggests failure. Instead, it is quite the opposite as it is a sign of faithful mission. As I have repeatedly celebrated our Net Working is full of great catches.


Our study will focus on:
