Dear St. Luke's,



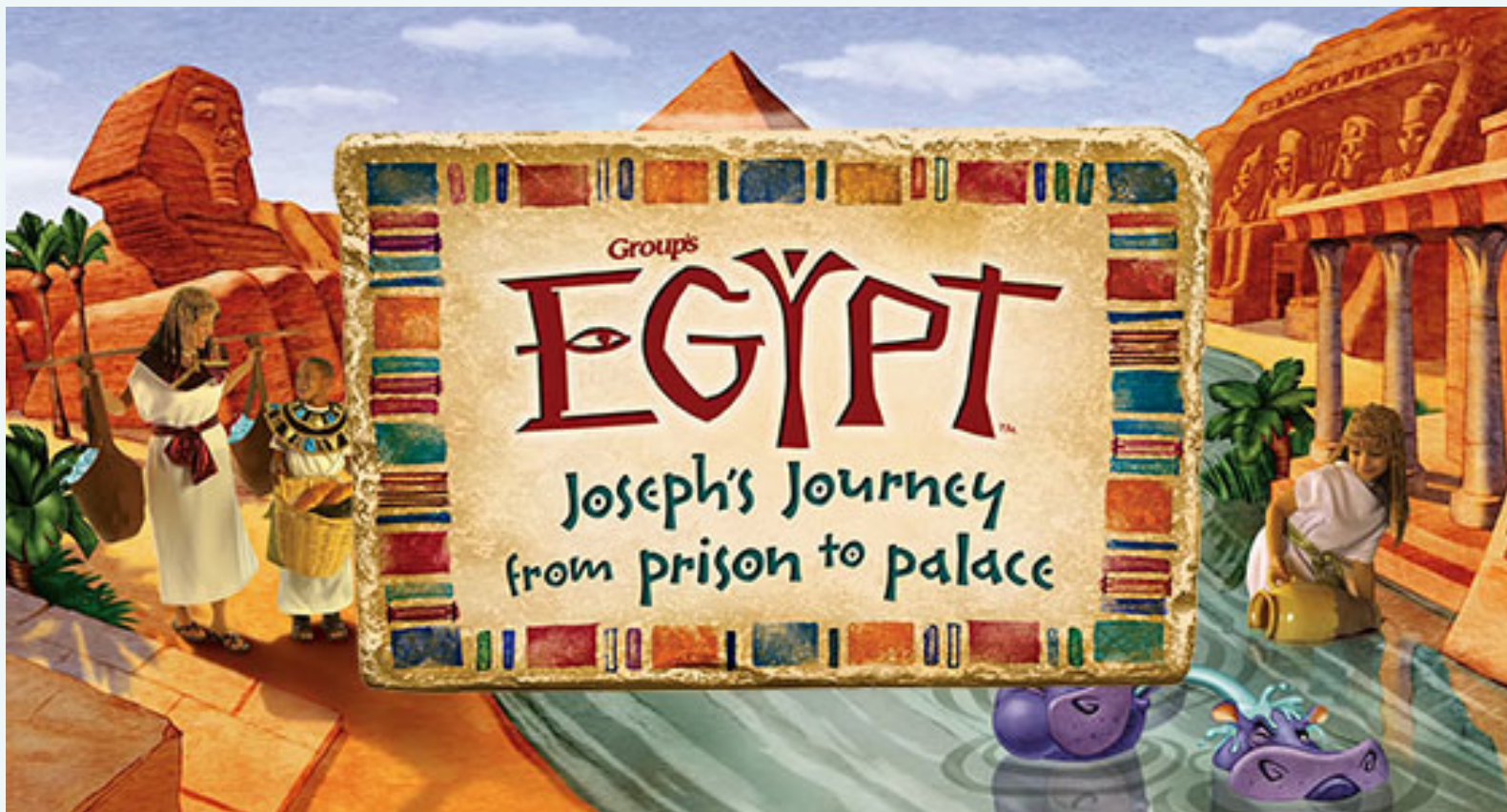

St. Luke's Challengers

2024 - 2025 REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Dear Parents,

We are writing to provide you with an update on the Challengers program at St. Luke's United Methodist Church for the upcoming school year.

Director Transition

As you know, we have been searching for a new director for the Challengers program. We are pleased to share that we have a couple of promising leads, and we anticipate the transition will take place over the summer. This will allow the program to start fresh with new leadership in the fall. Our interim and former director, Sheridan Harris, will continue to serve the Challengers program until the end of the school year. Please feel free to reach out to her with any questions regarding the registration process or financial concerns.

Program Details

For the upcoming school year, we will initially be offering spots to Zach Curlin Campus school families only, with current families having first priority. The last day to receive priority registration is June 1st. If your family includes an incoming kindergarten student, please let me know so I can open a registration spot for them. Upon availability, we will open registration to other University Schools students on June 2nd.

The program will continue to support extended learning pick up and University Middle School pick up.

Program Features

Our program is designed to provide a safe, nurturing, and stimulating environment for your children after school. We offer:

- **Individualized Care:** we maintain a 7:1 student/teacher ratio, which allows us to get to know our families personally.
- **Nutritious Snack:** snacks are offered at 3:15 for regular pick-up & 4:30 for extended learning.

- **Recreation:** Recreation is offered every day from 4:00-6:00pm. We will continue to utilize the gym, playground area, fellowship hall and lounge to give students the opportunity to move their bodies and be a kid. *campus athletics schedule has been adjusted to accommodate Challengers schedules
- **Homework Time:** homework time will be given Monday-Thursday during non-testing times.

Tuition and Fees

Tuition rates for the upcoming school year will be:

- Full-time (5 days a week): \$300
- Part-time (3 days a week): \$225

These rates are competitive with local after-school programs and reflect current inflation. A \$100 registration fee is required upon signing your child's contract. Family discounts will be applied to your registration fee, as opposed to a monthly discount.

New students will be considered for entry into the program after June 1st, pending available space.

Payments will be automatically drafted from your account on the 6th of every month. You will receive ONE reminder email 2 days before the payment is sent. If your payment fails to post on your account, a \$20 late fee will be applied. If your account becomes more than 1 month behind, students will not be picked up by the Challengers bus until your account is current again.

Registration Process

All contracts and forms will be sent out via Brightwheel. In order to claim a spot, please follow the instructions below:

1. Fill out the 2025-2026 registration for ALL children.
2. Upon approval, complete the 2025-2026 contract form for all children planning to attend the program. Please fill out the form with your preferred spot (full or part time)
3. Set up your Brightwheel account with a credit card for automatic payment. The payment schedule will begin on July 6th, one month ahead of the start date for University Schools.
4. An official contract and payment details will be sent via email. Challengers will officially reserve your spot once all steps are completed.
5. Pick-up will begin on the first day of school.

We are excited about the upcoming year and the opportunity to continue serving your family through the Challengers program.
