A few of you asked me to share some of the focus points from our stewardship sermon series on the promises we make when we join the church.

Prayers: Remember the word ACTS. It is an acronym for: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication. This pattern describes a movement and a flow in prayer. It is a great model to follow when you pray.

Presence: Can the church count on your attendance? Jesus Christ has proven we can count on Him to save us, forgive us, and establish a relationship with God. And in turn He asks us if He can count on us to give the church our allegiance and our presence.

Gifts: The widow challenges us to let our giving begin with humble acknowledgment that all we have and all we are comes from God. She challenges us to let our living grow out of our love for God. And she challenges us to respond with "thanksgiving". Giving that is made thankfully for God.

Service: We are called to serve others! Jesus says, "I didn't come to be served, I came to serve." There was once an Indian poet named Tagore. He wrote this short poem:

"I slept and dreamt that life was joy; Then I awake up and realized that life was service. And then I went to work and, lo and behold I discovered that service is joy."

Witness: We are called to be living, breathing evangelists. That's what it means to witness. St. Francis of Assisi said, "Preach the gospel at all times. If necessary, use words." Our lives are theological statement and a Biblical witness of what we believe and in whom we believe.

St. Luke's, prayer is a witness. Our presence is a witness. Our gifts are a witness. Our service is a witness. Several years ago, a visitor to Calcutta asked Mother Teresa, "How do you possibly hope to feed the millions of hungry people in this country?" Mother Teresa simply said, "One mouth at a time". That's how we, too, will make a difference in this world- by being a witness to one person at a time.

We will be on Thanksgiving Break, November 25-29, and Christmas Break, December 23 - January 3.






The Fun Bunch Activities
