Mercy and Grace Lead to Generosity

“Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift” (2 Corinthians 9:15)! This is St. Paul’s exclamation upon hearing the Corinthian church’s response to the preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and His request for support of the church in Jerusalem. The Christians in Corinth heard and received God’s mercy in Christ, and they responded to St. Paul’s call to support Christians in Jerusalem with a collection. The Corinthians’ joy filled Jerusalem’s need.

This is the reality of stewardship. Because of God’s generosity in the giving of His Son to die on the cross of us, we are to be generous with all that we receive from Him. What do we receive? Everything. All that we are and all that we have is the Lord’s. He is the creator and the giver. We are His creatures and those who receive what He gives.

It sounds easy. And it is. But then again, it isn’t. Stewardship is easy because it is God’s work. Through what God gives, we give to others. Through what God gives, we support the work of the church for the life of the world. He gives, we receive. And like our generous Father in Heaven, we, as His children, use what He gives to use to love and to serve others.

But stewardship is also difficult. This is because it goes against our natural inclination to think that what I have is mine to do what I want with. This is our sinful nature. It is our selfishness and our greed. How can we who have been given everything — life, food, clothing, house, home, forgiveness, divine Sonship, and eternal inheritance — be so stingy with what we give to the church, the place where we hear about and receive all that God gives us and does for us? We are all guilty of this kind of thinking. And the only godly response is to repent and trust in the Gospel.

For if God has given you His own Son, will He not give you all things? Yes, He will. This is His sure and certain promise. God provides for His people. He provides everything we need for this body and life and for the life that is to come.

The church is a mercy place. It’s a place where God’s mercy in the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ, is given and received. For us who believe it means forgiveness, life and salvation in the face of sin, death and the power of the devil. Here in the church, we inhale God’s mercy in Word and Sacrament, and exhale this same mercy in love and service to our neighbor. And that is an enduring, joyful thing to do. Our joy fills our neighbor’s need because His joy filled our (Hebrews 12:2). Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift!

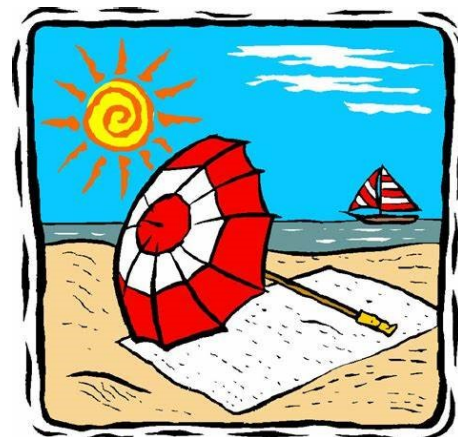

Our small class of Sunday School students are, again, sponsoring the gathering of school supplies for Lutheran Border Concerns Ministry. This is a project that they have undertaken for years. One of the teenagers is even bringing in his own money to contribute. Another student's mother has involved herself and a coworker to purchase supplies. You also can participate by purchasing the items asked for or donating money. During the month of August, you can put the donations in the designated box by the front door of the church.

One of the most profound ways that this ministry is making a difference in the lives of children are the scholarships that are being provided for students to attend school. Some have now graduated from high school and are seeking further education. Pastor Ramon Contreras, a graduate of Concordia Irvine, has deep connections with many congregations in California and hosts mission trips to Mexico to build homes, and minister to the people. - erasers approximately 2 inches long
- black or blue ballpoint pens

- boxes of colored markers
- boxes of colored pencils

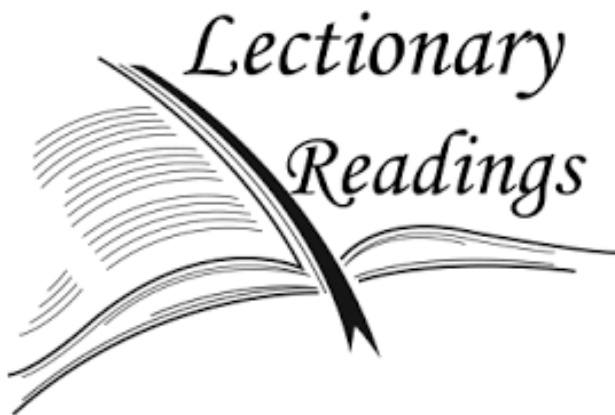
Sunday Worship at Home
