How Can We Help the L.A. Wildfire Victims? “Pray, Donate and Love,” says the Pacific Southwest District – LCMS



From the District Website:

So many of you may be wondering how you can best help the victims of these terrible fires. Our eagerness to serve and help those affected is part of loving our neighbor. It's important, however, to give the "right" help at the right time as expressed by the victims, not what we may assume they need. The most effective ways to help right now are:

Pray – Continue to lift up the victims, first responders, communities and all of us in prayer as we experience this significant disaster. This includes praying that we recognize the opportunities we have to share the light and love of Jesus to so many in need. Following is a prayer you can offer:

Lord, we lift up our eyes to the hills and see danger, threat, and fire. We ask with the Psalmist, “Where does our help come from?” It comes, as it always has and always will, from You Lord, the maker of heaven and earth! Give Your help, that is Your strength and support, to all those in need. Comfort those grieving loss, whether of life, home, or security. Send helpers into their lives to meet their immediate needs and to bear witness to Your love. Provide hope in the midst of grief, as only You can, because You are near with everlasting life and security that can never be taken away. Guide us to reach out to our neighbors with the grace and mercy of Christ. Enable us to listen and serve in the most helpful ways. Work in the lives of those who don’t yet believe with the gift of faith. Lord, throughout it all, assure us by Your death and resurrection that You overcome all things and redeem them for Your good purpose. Watch over our going out and coming in now and forever. In the name of our eternal help, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Donate – Victims have a significant immediate need for financial resources to purchase basic items, pay for hotel stays, pay for meals, etc. The PSD has a standing fund which you can donate funds to for this purpose. All of the funds donated to Emergency Relief will be used to support the congregations, schools, and individuals affected by the fires. Any excess funds will be saved for future emergency/disaster relief.

Update: Since the fires spread on Jan. 8, the PSD has received almost \$300,000 in donations for disaster relief. We praise God for your generosity and eagerness to help those in need! Your donations continue to fund Visa gift cards that are distributed to those impacted through the local congregations. More than \$23,000 has now been distributed to help victims purchase essentials and pay for gas, housing, etc. Your donations will also provide larger grants enabling families to pay for temporary housing and related expenses. The need is just beginning and will last for months if not years. Please give as you are able.

Love - Be the hands and feet of Jesus as you care spiritually for those you may come in contact with that are affected by this disaster, and even those who may not be in the immediate area but are traumatized. This especially applies to active, caring listening as they share their trauma and needs.

Were Any Pacific Southwest District Churches Damaged in the Fires?

Historic First Lutheran - Pasadena, CA

Six members had total losses and six more in the greater faith community (former members and immediate family) had total losses. A former school student died in her home (cause of death was burns and smoke inhalation). More than \$9,000 in gift cards have been distributed to members and community. Comfort dogs will be present every Sunday for the foreseeable future. Price gouging on rents continues, including \$3,000 rental units now suddenly priced substantially more, despite orders from the Governor.

Palisades Lutheran Church - Pacific Palisades, CA

The church building is still standing, but Palisades Lutheran Church is estimated to be shut down for at least 6 months. The parsonage is unlivable, and no one is allowed back to the church. Prayers have been answered as a place to worship has been offered free of charge! On Sunday, February 2, at 10 a.m., Palisades Lutheran Church will be worshipping at Annenberg Community Beach House, 415 Pacific Coast Hwy, Santa Monica, CA 90402. At least 85% of our members are displaced and have dispersed to shelters, hotels, apartments, or friends and family. Fixed costs must still be paid. We need to cover short-term housing for the church workers and members. Please see www.plc.cc for more info on how to give.

Pilgrim Lutheran Church/Pacifica Christian High School - Santa Monica, CA

About 20 Pacifica Christian H.S. student families have lost homes. Gift cards continue to be distributed and are much appreciated.

First Lutheran Church - Venice, CA

One member has lost their home.

First Lutheran Temple City Answers This Call

Update from the January 26 First Lutheran Voters Meeting: Our congregation currently tithes 10% of its income to the District, and at the January 26 meeting, members voted to increase that giving to 11% starting this year, with the extra 1% designated for disaster relief.

The Orphan Grain Train (a Recognized Service Organization of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod) is making available a limited number of \$1,000 grants to people who have lost either their home or their business in the Los Angeles fires. 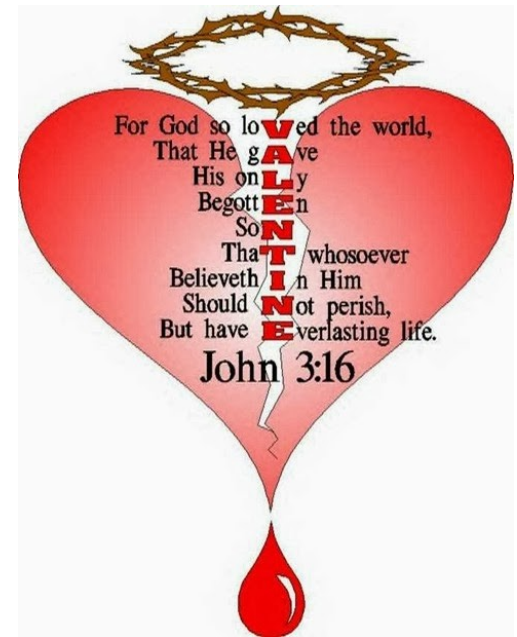

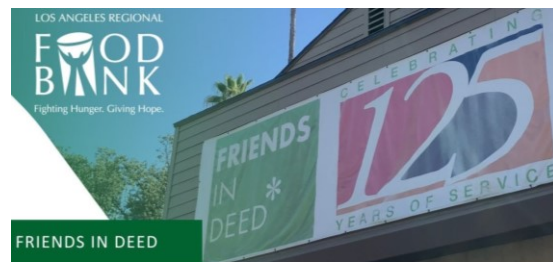

Friends in Deed

areas. They are currently providing food to over 600 households per week, totaling approximately 1,225 people. This dynamic and compassion-driven program is the largest at Friends In Deed. Their Food Pantry is set up like a neighborhood market where the community members can come in and select their own groceries. In addition to providing shelf stable foods like canned goods, dry goods, juice, and cereal, one of their goals is to provide meat & protein, fresh fruits & vegetables, and foods that appeal to the diverse population in our community. When available, the pantry also offers toiletries, diapers & formula, and pet food. Consider donating canned tuna/chicken, hearty soups, beef stew, chili, pasta & pasta sauce, peanut butter, cereal, rice, cooking oil, flour, sugar, shelf stable fruit juices, powdered or shelf stable milk, granola bars, and canned fruits & vegetables. 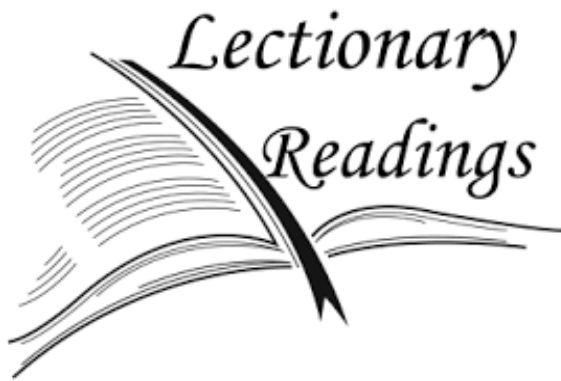

Did You Know?

- The Red Cross provides about 40% of our nation's blood and blood components, all from generous volunteer donors. But supply can't always meet demand because only about 3% of age-eligible people donate blood yearly. Each new donor helps us meet patient needs.
- Every 2 seconds someone in the U.S. needs blood and/or platelets.
- One donation can save more than one life.
- A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 units of blood.
- The average red blood cell transfusion can require up to 100 units of blood.
- Approximately 29,000 units of red blood cells are needed every day in the U.S.
- According to the American Cancer Society, more than 1.9 million people are expected to be diagnosed with cancer this year. Many of them will need blood, sometimes daily, during their chemotherapy treatment.
