The Rewards of Godliness

It's no secret that you can't bribe your way into heaven. No amount of good works will impress God enough to open heaven's door for their sake. "For the wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23) and the person who "keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it" (James 2:10). Rather, salvation is "the free gift of God ... in Christ Jesus" (Romans 6:23).

So, your good works won't earn you the reward of heaven. But does that mean that there are no rewards at all? Consider what the Small Catechism says in the "Close of the Commandments":

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments."
(Exodus 20:5–6)

What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands. (SC II)

God promises to bless you in keeping His commandments. What might these blessings be? Well, consider what Paul says about keeping the Fourth Commandment: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land'" (Ephesians 6:1–3).

And think about what your life would be like if you went around stealing (breaking the Seventh Commandment), telling lies about people (breaking the Eighth Commandment), and generally being cruel to those around you (breaking all the commandments!). That is obviously not a blessed way to live. In fact, you'd be miserable living that way.

And Jesus says more about what is in store for those who make sacrifices for His sake:

"Jesus said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for My name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life'" (Matthew 19:28–29).

So don't grow impatient in doing good. Follow the Lord who has freely given you everlasting life.

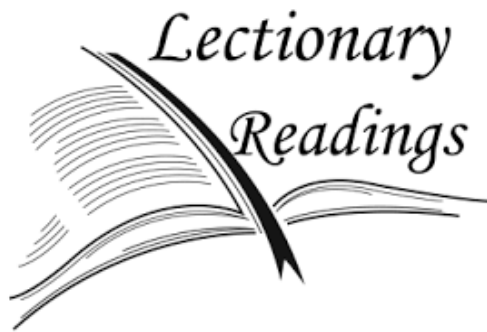
Sunday Worship at Home

LSSSC News for Your Church

Do You Know Someone with Lived Experience in Recovery and/or Mental Health?

People who have had to experience and navigate through “the system” make great coaches, supports, and allies for those currently trying to find services in the system. That’s what a “Peer Support Specialist” (PSS) does – come alongside individuals and families

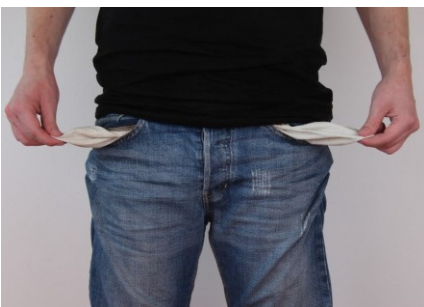
who are dealing with recovery and/or mental health challenges to offer support. PSSs provide support, advocacy, encouragement, affirmation, acceptance, resources, and hope to others. They share their personal experiences and provide support to help break down barriers and empower people to find and follow their own recovery paths. PSSs do important work!

As a California Mental Health Services (CalMHSA) approved provider, LSSSC offers a 100-hour Medi-Cal Peer Support Specialist Training that includes 80 hours of online, self-paced, curriculum and a 20-hour supervised internship. Program staff offer assistance with career planning and job placement at agencies throughout the state. This Medi-Cal Peer Support Specialist Training is free to the residents of California.
