What is a Christian to do with the Season of Pentecost?

The miracle of Pentecost is not merely a past historical event. The Spirit's wondrous activity goes on in the Church today.

Traditionally, the Church has observed this day as one of the most important festivals of the year. But unlike Christmas or Easter, Pentecost doesn't have the cultural attachments that remind us of its significance. There are no ornamented trees, strings of lights, or wrapped presents to announce the season, no egg-filled baskets or Easter lilies to proclaim the day. Without cultural traditions behind it, we may wonder how to celebrate Pentecost. Is it really as important as the other days? Why do we observe Pentecost at all?



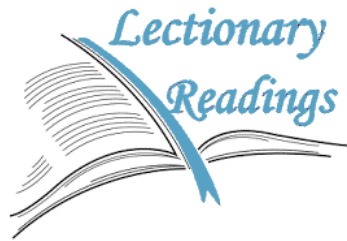
The Church celebrates the Festival of Pentecost as the fulfillment and conclusion of the Easter season. The name Pentecost, meaning "the fiftieth day," originally referred to the Jewish Festival of Weeks, the time of thanksgiving for first-fruits and the ingathering of the harvest (Exodus 34:22). The Christian Church retained the name to mark the completion of the 50-day period after Easter—and the first in-gathering of believers into the Church.

On Pentecost, Christians commemorate the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We recall how a humble fisherman, filled with the Spirit, boldly proclaimed Jesus Christ crucified and risen from the dead. We give thanks that a multitude of hearers repented and believed. Three thousand people, from all over the world, were baptized and received the gift of the Spirit. Sent by God the Father, and by His Son, Jesus Christ, the Spirit came to continue the Father's work on earth.

The Spirit's activity continues today. That's why the Christian celebration of Pentecost is such a joyful one—and so vital for the Church to remember. Through the preaching of the Gospel and Baptism, the Holy Spirit calls and gathers believers to Christ and His Church. This gracious work is ongoing; it is not yet completed in our lives.

The Spirit works among people of every nation and language—among all to whom the Church is sent to proclaim the Gospel. For this reason, Christians pray for the continued outpouring of the Spirit and for the fulfillment of His sanctifying work.

piano, violin, music theory, and musicianship which God has used greatly later on in her life. At 12 years old, she lost her earthly father and moved to Taipei, where she attended a Baptist church because her mother was a Christian. She received Jesus as her Savior at 13 and began serving God by playing piano in the worship services.

At 18, Esther immigrated to the U.S. with her mother. She received her B.S. degree in Business Administration at Cal State, Los Angeles and then her CPA license. During this time, she still served God with her musical gifts at Mandarin Baptist Churches of Pasadena and Los Angeles. After resigning as an accountant from the City of Los Angeles, God led her to Lutheran Church of the Cross in Arcadia to work as the music director for four years before her current position. Her favorite Bible verse is Romans 8:28, *“And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose.”*

FLC's Blood Drive Honored World Blood Donor Day, June 14



World Blood Donor Day has been celebrated around the world on June 14 every year since 2004. It marks the birthday of Karl Landsteiner on June 14, 1868. He won the Nobel Prize for his discovery of the ABO blood group system.

First Lutheran held a blood drive that day and welcomed 22 people who came to donate blood, 19 of whom successfully donated. Five of them were first time donors, including Darren Choi, a recent Temple City High School graduate who has attended Sunday School at First Lutheran for years.

FLC has held three blood drives in the last year: June 2024 and February and June 2025. Our own Peter Dille has organized them with the help of the American Red Cross and the Mission Development Team. FLC will offer more blood drives in the future: This newsletter let you know the dates!

Monthly Luncheon: Hot Dogs & All the Fixin's

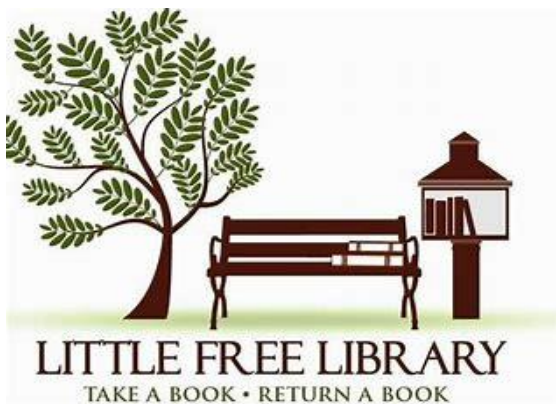

They work in Papua New Guinea with Wycliffe Bible Translators.



Matt and Emily are proud parents of Claire and Elijah and support Bible translation in Papua New Guinea - the country that has more languages than anywhere else on earth! Technology has dramatically sped up the work of Bible translation, and computer support staff are crucial to the task of reaching remaining language groups with God's Word.

Matt provides technical support for translation teams as a Network Engineer at Ukarumpa translation center. Emily works part-time helping manage a ministry called S.A.L.T. (Scripture Application & Leadership Training). This ministry sends teams of Papua New Guinean Bible teachers throughout the country to run Bible study courses while also encouraging the use of mother tongue Bible translations.
