When most people think of something that is "powerful", they probably think of a powerful car, a powerful weapon, or a powerful natural event, such as an earthquake, a storm, or a tsunami. Other people might think of powerful people: powerful business leaders like Jeff Bezos, the world's richest man; political leaders like President Trump or President Xi Jinping of China; or athletes like LeBron James. Still other people might think of powerful ideas that have captivated the minds of millions of people, ideas like freedom or equality.

All of the above are certainly powerful, but we Christians have been given a gift that is more powerful *than all of them put together*: the gift of the Holy Spirit. People tend to think of the Holy Spirit as something purely "religious", that is, something confined to what goes on in churches or in the small, narrow lives of religious people. But the Holy Spirit is actually so powerful that he participated in the creation of the entire universe, from the largest galaxy to the smallest amoeba. The Holy Spirit's power is infinite, whereas every other power is finite, and because of that the Spirit can do something that no other power can do: he can change the human heart.

The human heart is the most difficult thing in the world to change, because it is the most complicated thing in the world. But since the Holy Spirit's power is so great – and because he always makes Jesus Christ present in the real world here and now – the Spirit can turn sinners into saints, cowards into heroes, and hopeless situations into situations brimming over with the brightest possibilities. Just as Jesus rose from the dead, the Holy Spirit can raise people up from the death of sin, despair, and depression and gives them abundant and eternal life.

We celebrate the great Festival of Pentecost on Sunday June 9, and I join with you in thanking God for the infinitely good gift of the Holy Spirit. I also look forward to seeing what the Holy Spirit will be doing in your life and mine – and in the life of First Lutheran Church of Temple City.


Our summer program begins July 1st we ask for prayers for a continued growing enrollment through Fall and for a successful safe summer!

Saving Postage Stamps:

For decades people would carefully cut off commemorative stamps from letters and send them to



mission projects. Some of you may remember that Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) collected stamps for missions for many years. Recently I was going through stuff and found some large envelopes filled with cancelled stamps that had been collected. Using my computer I found a group that still wants cancelled stamps. The Veterans' National Stamp and Coin Club located at the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Tucson Arizona is an organization that passes the stamps

on to Veterans Affairs support centers across the nation. The stamps and coins, etc. are for therapeutic use helping veterans. I had a very interesting phone conversation with a World War II veteran at the hospital who is in charge of the program. Talk to Jo Tschopp for further information, and save those stamps.

Friends in Deed:

Tim, the Director of the Friends in Deed Food Pantry, recently sent an email thanking us for the fun group of volunteers who help there every 4th Saturday. He has scheduled us through June of 2020. The motto for the pantry is "Doing together what we cannot do alone." We cannot hand out food to the financially challenged but we can purchase items, bring them to church, place them in the designated area and know that they will be distributed to the needy. Some of those that need help are alone and elderly, some work two or more jobs, but still need assistance.

Special Projects:

The <u>new red carpet</u> has been installed in the church! We continue to thank all the members who financially contributed, and also to the members who dusted the pews, kneelers, furniture, and cleaned the floors. It was truly a large job cleaning up after the installation. Don't forget to check out the new carpeting on the west stairs going up to the balcony; the color is different with the hope that it will not show sun fading. The last remaining project is painting the iron fence & gates on Broadway and Noel. We have the funds; the painter has put it on his schedule.

Burn the Mortgage!

We continue to make progress in our goal to pay off the church mortgage. The Board of Directors has voted to direct any extra rental money, which is above the budget, towards the debt reduction. For May we have sent \$895 which includes a continuing \$60 weekly contribution from a member. Since January 2019 we have directed \$9,756 towards the debt in addition to the monthly mortgage payment of \$5020. The principal is getting smaller!

Voters' Meeting:

Our twice-yearly Voters' Meeting will be held in June. There has been a conflict with the date. All current voters will be notified two weeks before the meeting. The information will also be printed in the worship bulletin. The agenda will include election of officers to a one-year term, financial reports, preschool report, pulpit supply, and other committee reports. A light luncheon will be served at 11:00, after the Bible class. To become a member of the voters you need to be a member of First Lutheran, attend a Voters' Meeting and ask to be received as a voter. At the next meeting you will be welcomed as a voting member. Anyone is invited to the meetings as a guest.

Reading the Lectionaries:

If you are reading the lectionaries during the week as preparation for Sunday worship you will notice that June 2 is the last Sunday of Easter, and on June 9 we will celebrate Pentecost. Pentecost marks the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus. Often it is the day that confirmations and baptisms are scheduled. The paraments will be red, symbolizing fire and the Holy Spirit. The Christian celebration of Pentecost coincides closely with the Jewish celebration of Shavuot, which is the spring harvest festival of the



Israelites. Many Jews were in Jerusalem for the festival when the Holy Spirit descended. On the following Sunday we celebrate Trinity Sunday, which is the one time of the year that the Athanasian Creed is read. The paraments will be white symbolizing purity, birth, and innocence. As you read the lectionaries see if you can find a connection between the Epistle and the Gospel.
