

CELEBRATING THE GOODNESS OF GOD

IN WORSHIP MINISTRY

Psalm 34 says, "Oh, taste and see that the Lord is good." In every corner of Calvary's worship ministry, from the harmonious voices of the choir to the resonating power of the orchestra, we see the unmistakable hand of God at work. His goodness is the unifying thread that binds us together, inspiring us to offer our best in worship, both individually and corporately. Through every rehearsal, every song, and every moment of worship, we experience the transformative presence of God. When reflecting on the past year, Judd Wilson said that the highlight of 2024 for our choir and orchestra was the culmination of our Night of Christmas Worship. He went on to say, "The scripture says to 'make a joyful noise.' (Psalm 100:1) A lot of people think 'I can't do choir because I don't feel like I can sing or I don't have the voice for it,' but really, you'd be surprised if you just give it a shot because it's a way that you can bless the Lord and lift His praises through song. We really look at ourselves in the choir as worship leaders — that's not just

one person, that's all of us, and you can be a worship leader right up there with us. I highly encourage you to do that."

THE IMPACT OF WORSHIP

Worship is more than music; it's a lifestyle that draws us closer to God and equips us to reflect His love to the world. This truth comes alive as individuals dedicate their talents to glorify Him. As Ray Jones, a renowned Worship Leader and Founder of Radiance Ministries, once said, "When God's people sing, walls come down, hearts are healed, and the atmosphere of worship changes lives." We've seen this firsthand — how worship not only touches our hearts but how God uses it to break chains that bring healing and freedom. I am in awe when God speaks to the hearts of our congregation and individuals one at a time begin to stand or raise their hands in obedience to what is being heard. This is true worship.

UNITY IN DIVERSITY

One of the greatest blessings to witness within the worship ministry is the diverse talents, skill levels, backgrounds, and individual testimonies that span across the multiple generations that come together to create something beautiful. John Bolin, Pastor of Worship Ministries at Kingsland Baptist in Katy, TX, described it wonderfully: "Worship is the intersection where heaven meets earth, and everyone has a role to play in that divine moment." At Calvary, this is evident as each voice and instrument add a unique layer to the tapestry of worship, reminding us that we are stronger together.

GENERATIONAL WORSHIP: LEGACY OF PRAISE

The worship ministry extends beyond the adult choirs and orchestras to include vibrant kids' choirs, youth choirs, and a dynamic youth praise band. These younger generations bring a fresh energy and perspective to our worship, embodying the joy and enthusiasm of serving the Lord. Ray Jones reminds us, "The heart of worship is passed down through generations when we invite young people to join the song." In our kids' choir, we see the seeds of faith being planted as children learn to praise God with their voices on both Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings and with the culmination of their Christmas musical. The youth choir and praise band take that passion a step further, expressing their faith in creative and powerful ways that resonate with their peers and inspire both the youth group and the entire congregation. At the other end of the generational spectrum, our senior adult choir, the Singin' Saints, exemplify the



enduring power of worship. These faithful servants continue to glorify God with their voices, demonstrating that worship is a lifelong calling. Through their ministry, they inspire younger generations with their steadfast faith and love for the Lord. Dr. Jim Whitmire, former longtime Minister of Music at Bellevue Baptist, Memphis and current Worship Leader at Crossroads Baptist, Eads, TN, said it best: "When generations worship together, the church experiences the fullness of God's design for His people."

GOD'S FAITHFULNESS IN GROWTH

My family and I have been deeply moved by God's never-ending faithfulness as He has guided us to Calvary. I've been inspired as I've witness His continued faithfulness in building upon the rich legacy of the music ministry, a foundation laid by the dedication of so many faithful servants. Members have joined, fresh opportunities to serve have arisen, and the impact of our worship has reached beyond the church walls. Mike Harland, former Director of Lifeway Music and

current Founder of Worship Essentials, once said, "The songs we sing today are the testimonies of tomorrow." This resonates deeply within us as we see God's goodness in our worship to sow seeds of hope and faith.

MEDIA MINISTRY: AMPLIFYING THE GOSPEL

Another form of worship at Calvary, renowned for its enduring legacy of service to our community, is our Media Ministry. God is moving powerfully through this ministry which plays a vital role in the areas of sound, lighting, videography, photography, and so much more. Under the leadership of Director of Media, Joe Gilley, this ministry has embraced its mission to enhance our worship experience and extend our reach beyond the church walls. I once heard someone say, "A church media ministry is a powerful tool to amplify the Gospel message, reaching beyond the walls of the building and into the digital spaces where people are already spending their time, allowing us to share the light of Christ in the modern world." Excited about the possibilities




of what God is doing as our media ministry continues to grow, Joe stated, "I am super excited about the potential in our media ministry! Over the years, Calvary has been known for investing a lot of time and energy into our media and I am grateful for the opportunity to continue that and to build on it. As technology has changed, there is an ever-increasing number of tools that we can use to aid in worship and set the environment for people to encounter God and see His name lifted high. That is our single, solitary goal as a media team and although God has given us an amazing team to help facilitate that, we will be adding a handful of new teams to assist in these areas and will need a lot more help. The definition of the word compelled, according to dictionary.com, is as follows: "forced or driven to a particular course of action, often by an irresistible internal urge." I really love that! It demonstrates so well that which occurs within the heart and soul of a believer. This Holy Spirit's prompting within us is why we raise our hands during a worship service, why tears stream down our face during a particular song, testimony, or scripture reading; why we must serve others, share about our Lord, and give our resources to bring about the change that comes along with being a child of the King! We desire to see the same compelling of the Spirit in others that is within us.

If there has been a time you have accepted Jesus as the risen Savior and asked Him for forgiveness of your sins, then you are a child of God. As His children, we read His instructions in the Bible. Our desire, as we study and grow in our relationship with the Father, should be to imitate Jesus. Last year was an incredible example of that. We had over 100 members serve through Compelled By Love projects: ministering to church members with needs at their homes, visiting and writing letters to guests and shut-ins, and completing maintenance projects at the church; through our Community Breakfast; and a number of other opportunities. Countless of you served by providing resources that were requested and by providing financial gifts to support our mission efforts. THANK YOU for following the leadership of the Holy Spirit!

In this upcoming year, we have trips scheduled to New Orleans, LA; Yreka, CA; and Malawi, Africa. Our Compelled By Love projects begin on the first Sunday night of each month from March through October, and there are a multitude of other opportunities to serve in every ministry area of our church! In the gospel of Luke, Jesus shared the Parable of the Great Feast. Within the parable, He talked about inviting others to be a part. Chapter 14 verse 23 in the NLT states, "Go out into the country lanes and behind the hedges and urge anyone you find to come, so that the house will be full." This is our desire! We want the house to be full! Not just the house at Calvary, but the house in New Orleans, Yreka, Malawi, and the ends of the earth. Sunday school classes, mission teams, choir/orchestra and media ministries, children's/student ministry volunteers, etc.; ALL have a place for your gifts to be used. What is it that our Father is compelling you to be a part of?

Do you want your Sunday school class to grow?

Fill this chair with an individual who will be drawn to You to grow and become a Disciple of Jesus. We ask, Lord, that you hear our prayer, and honor our request for Your Glory and Honor only. In the precious name of Jesus, we pray, AMEN.

HOLY GROUND ...AND POTATO SALAD

If you had told me 3 months ago that I would have a 'Holy Ground' moment while up to my elbows in an industrial-sized bowl of potato salad, I probably would have laughed. But such is the nature of our God who creates, who calls, who provides, who laughs: continually offering an invitation to join Him in the work He is doing.

Michael came in from church one evening after attending a mission trip interest meeting. In his hand he held, not one, but two, applications. "I hope you'll go with me." The multitude of complexities of both of us leaving our children and flying over the sea for a mission trip sandwiched snugly between Thanksgiving and Christmas seemed mind-boggling. I consented to at least praying about it. Throwing fear to the wind and gripping my fragile faith with all my might, I asked the Lord for three clear "Go's," if He indeed wanted me to go. Boy, did He deliver. Through a sermon, a devotional reading, and a scripture passage, He clearly articulated what I was hesitant to hear. "Go."

We landed in Santo Domingo on a warm, sunny Saturday afternoon, overpacked and prayed up. I was prepared for mosquitoes, heat, and sunburn, and fully equipped for a myriad of dress codes. What I was not prepared for was the literal breath-taking beauty of miles and miles of virgin coastline, waters bluer than a crayon, and portrait-quality palm trees arched perfectly over the horizon. Our 70's style white van, equipped with vinyl seats and fringed drapes, flew down the highway, and I decided it was in the better interest of my mental health to *not* watch the road and on-coming traffic; I watched the inspiring landscape instead. I snapped a ridiculous number of pictures trying to capture the views that felt nearly fake, so staggering was their beauty. Every curve brought a new perspective and apparently a gasp from me. (Gasps from the views and the traffic were equal in quantity!) Every scene of creation directed my thoughts to Genesis 1, "And God saw that it was good."

The road got rougher, and our van, which I affectionately and prayerfully referred to as the REAL struggle bus, sent us nearly airborne in our seats as it overcame ruts, rocks, and uneven terrain. We eased into a town and replacing the palm trees, rocks, and waves was an even greater aspect of creation: faces – old and lined, young and full, some creased with worry, many dusty and smiling. Humanity and weakness housing the very image of God. "And God saw that it was very good." Gen. 1:31

Over the course of the week, we were privileged to greet many faces. On Sunday evening, we worshipped with a Haitian congregation. Their singing was bold and loud, with a variety of instruments – some homemade. Their singing expanded over an hour, and instead of waning in strength

and volume, their voices crescendoed in praise! Their fervor and stamina in worship was convicting.

We ultimately worked with three different churches (two with Haitian congregations, one with Dominican) doing door-to-door evangelism, giving rice and beans, and aiding in

Christmas dinners for the local children at each church. You'll not meet a more hospitable people. At one point, this was evidenced by an elderly lady who was sweeping the street in front of her home when she paused her work to offer us coffee.

During our door-to-door evangelism, many made decisions for Christ, while some heard the gospel and declined. These evangelistic conversations took place on rocky paths, under trees, on the street, and inside homes that resembled hovels.

Prayers were offered for every consenting person we encountered, whether for healing, provision, protection, or strength in their Christian journey. Once, while mid-prayer for a family whose mother had unexpectedly died in childbirth, her four-day-old baby was placed in my arms. Another ministry opportunity involved a conversation between Kim and a woman saved out of a life of Vodou. Her family is devout and is constantly urging her to return. She plainly stated that she'd rather die than to return to that life. Shannon and I gave our best healthcare advice to a mother with a sick child. Out of all the glaring personal needs she could've mentioned, one woman asked Michael to pray for political peace between the striving nations of Haiti and Dominican Republic. Jeanne and Jason talked some time with a professing atheist who seemed suspiciously hungry for something more. All of these conversations and moments of prayer were heavy with need, but buoyed by hope, not unlike labor pains: excruciating, but promising new life. John 16:21



"But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

Acts 1:8 is our Mission Model:
