

## Pastor's Devotional



**1 Peter 3:14 — But even if you should suffer for what is right, you are blessed. “Do not fear their threats; do not be frightened.**


**I**n 1 Peter 3:14, Peter is juxtaposing two ideas that seemingly don't fit together: suffering and being blessed. When we think of blessed, we think of the tangible and sometimes intangible rewards we receive from God for our faithfulness. We are blessed when we receive unexpected financial resources, we are blessed when we are given things we don't deserve, we are blessed when we are kept from danger and harm, we are blessed when we are healed from a physical ailment, we don't think of ourselves as being blessed when we suffer. **Verse 14 almost leads us to question if Peter understands what it means to be blessed.**

The term blessed refers to status conferred on one by another, the word means to be honored or esteemed by someone. Sometimes evidence of our standing or blessed status can be tangible such as money and materials but that isn't always the case. We are blessed when God chooses to use us to participate in his work, we are blessed when God involves us in the things that he is doing, we are blessed when God chooses to use us for his glory, those things more so than the tangible and material things indicate our standing and status before God. And because being blessed is a status and position before God, you can be blessed and broke, you can be blessed and struggling, and you can be blessed and suffering. Your situation is not always an indication of your status before God. God can think highly of you, God can favor you; you can be honored by God, even when there may not be any tangible evidence of your blessed status. **Karen Jobes writes, that it is the privilege of living rightly because of Christ and suffering for it that is nothing less than a blessing and a sign of God's favor and evidence of one's salvation.** When God uses you and

empowers you to do his will, regardless of your outward circumstances, that signals you are blessed.



In Job chapter 1, we are introduced to a man whose life seems to have all the indications of a blessed status before God. He is one of the wealthiest men of his region, and he had 10 children another possible indication of how blessed he was. Then the curtains of heaven are pulled back and we are allowed to eavesdrop on a conversation between Satan and God. **We know that Satan was on the look out for someone whose life he could ruin and destroy, and knowing this God points Satan in the direction of Job, God says about Job, “Have you considered my servant Job? There is no one on earth like him; he is blameless and upright, a man who fears God and shuns evil.”** Because God mentions Job's name, it sets in motion a series of events that would lead to Job losing his wealth, his children, and his health.



The book of Job gives us two indicators of Job's special status before God, the first is that God graciously rewarded Job with material possessions, with health and wealth, and house full of children; and the second indicator that Job enjoyed special status before God is the God hand picked Job to suffer because Job was righteous in his affair. Job was blessed when he had everything, and Job was blessed when he was suffering. Job's experiences change our understanding of what it means to be blessed: being blessed is not seen in our tangible assets but in our relationship with God. We are blessed when we are rightly related to God.



## MISSIONARY OF THE MONTH



Duane Mansveld and Miriam Beau are Streetworkers with PAX- Communauté de la Rue, a ministry that exists to help the homeless and marginalized of Montreal connect to God, to others, and to the world, and a ministry of l'Association d'Église Baptiste Évangélique du Québec, and Missions Door.

Duane was born and raised in Pembroke, Ontario, and has known the streets since age 15. At the age of 18, Duane accepted Christ as Lord and Savior. In 1993, Duane began three years of street missionary training in Montreal, and it was there that he met his wife Miriam. Miriam's parents came to Quebec as missionaries from Europe in the 1950s, and Miriam accepted the Lord at the age of 6. She was introduced to the streets by friends who lived there. During that time, God showed Miriam His heart for the street youth, their needs, and their incredible potential. It was then that the Lord gave Miriam the call to minister to street youth full time.

Duane and Miriam were married in June of 1996. They have been blessed with one son, Jeremie.

### Prayer Needs:

- More migrant families are appearing in Quebec. The city has shelters to help individuals and couples, but none for families. Pray that Duane and Miriam can continue to meet needs as they appear in this vulnerable population.
- Duane will be presenting a workshop on best practices for street outreach to homeless veterans in Nova Scotia in November. Pray for clarity of mind and clear communication. Pray for the needs of homeless veterans to be met.
- Please pray for Duane and Miriam's continued work with the police of Longueuil as they provide education to promote compassion and understanding for the street community and other marginalized people. These relationships have created amazing re-connections, including helping a police officer find his homeless uncle that his family hadn't had contact with.

Remember, 10% of Central's tithes and offerings go to support our missionaries.


