



# STEPS OF A DISCIPLESHIP MEETING!

Your time together should be around 1 hour to 1.5 hours. Plan to meet at a consistent time weekly, or biweekly.

## STEP 1: HAVE A GENERAL LIFE CHECK-IN!

## STEP 2: PRAY OVER YOUR TIME TOGETHER



# READ: GENESIS 14

## QUESTIONS

1. How can we learn to 'thrive in turmoil' as Christians, and what practical steps can we take to grow spiritually during difficult times?
2. In what ways does Abram's rescue of Lot demonstrate love for God and neighbor, and how can we apply this example to our own lives?
3. How does Melchizedek's role as both priest and king foreshadow Jesus Christ, and what significance does this have for our understanding of Christ's ministry?
4. What can we learn from Abram's decision to tithe to Melchizedek about supporting God's mission on earth today?
5. How does the concept of 'loving your neighbor' evolve throughout Scripture, and in what ways can we continually improve our ability to love others?
6. What does it mean to 'fight' for others spiritually, and how can we engage in spiritual warfare on behalf of those in our lives?
7. How does Abram's encounter with Melchizedek challenge or affirm our understanding of worship and spiritual authority outside our immediate faith community?
8. In what ways can we identify God's mission being carried out around us, and how should this influence our stewardship of resources?
9. How does the historical accuracy of biblical accounts, such as the specific locations mentioned in this passage, impact our faith and understanding of Scripture?
10. What lessons can we draw from Abram's refusal to accept wealth from the king of Sodom, and how might this apply to ethical decision-making in our own lives?
