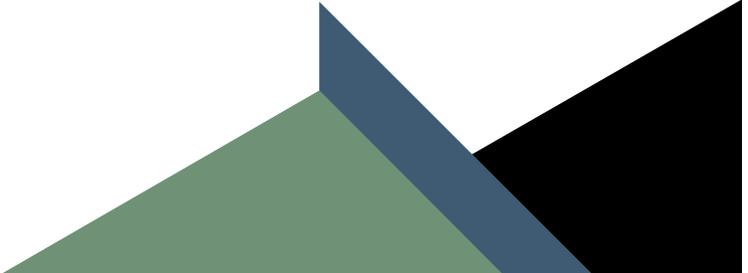



DAY 1: GOD'S SOVEREIGN MISSION

Reading: Genesis 15:1-21

As we reflect on God's covenant with Abram, we're reminded that God is the ultimate architect of His plan for humanity. Just as He promised Abram descendants and land, God has a purpose for each of us. Sometimes, like Abram, we may question God's timing or methods. But today's passage reminds us that God's plans are sure, even when we can't see how they'll unfold.

Take a moment to consider areas in your life where you're struggling to trust God's plan. Pray for the faith to believe, even when you can't see the full picture.





DAY 2: FAITH IN THE UNSEEN

Reading: Hebrews 11:1-16

Hebrews 11 showcases the faith of biblical heroes, including Abraham. These individuals trusted God's promises before seeing their fulfillment. In our own lives, we're often called to step out in faith without knowing the outcome. Reflect on a time when God asked you to trust Him despite uncertainty. How did that experience shape your faith?

Today, challenge yourself to take a step of faith in an area where you've been hesitant. Remember, our faith is not in our own abilities, but in God's faithfulness.






DAY 3: GOD'S PROTECTION AND PRESENCE

Reading: Psalm 91

In Genesis 15, God assured Abram, "I am your shield." Psalm 91 expands on this theme of divine protection. As you read, notice the vivid imagery used to describe God's care for His people. In what areas of your life do you need to experience God as your shield today?

Remember, staying behind God's shield means aligning our will with His and not running ahead of His timing. Take time to surrender your plans and fears to God, trusting in His protection and presence.






DAY 4: THE ASSURANCE OF SALVATION

Reading: Ephesians 2:1-10

The sermon emphasized that our salvation is entirely God's work, not our own. This passage in Ephesians beautifully articulates this truth. We are saved by grace through faith, not by our own efforts. Reflect on the freedom this brings – we don't have to earn God's love or work to maintain our salvation.

How does this truth impact your daily walk with God?

Thank Him for the gift of salvation and ask for help in living out of gratitude rather than obligation.





DAY 5: GOD AT WORK IN OUR LIVES

Reading: Philippians 2:12-13

"For it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose." This verse reminds us that God is actively working in and through us, even when we can't see or understand it. Think about areas in your life where you're struggling to see God at work.

Instead of striving in your own strength, ask God to reveal how He's moving. Pray for the patience to trust His timing and the wisdom to cooperate with His work in your life. Remember, our role is to remain faithful and obedient, trusting that God is accomplishing His purposes through us.
