As winter settles in and temperatures drop, the needs of our neighbors often become more visible—and more urgent. Cold nights, empty pantries, inadequate clothing, and loneliness can weigh heavily on those who are already struggling. Yet Scripture continually reminds us that God’s people are called to be a source of light to the world. We offer warmth, compassion, and hope in a cold and dark world. This season provides a powerful opportunity for the church to embody the love of Christ in tangible ways.

Jesus makes the connection between love for God and love for neighbor unmistakably clear in his second of the great commandments: “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” (Mark 12:31). Loving our neighbor is not merely a suggestion—it is a defining mark of genuine faith. When we provide a coat, prepare a meal, or offer a listening ear, we reflect the heart of our Savior who came near to us in our greatest need.

Scripture also brings to life the need of practical necessities: “If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, and one of you says to them, ‘Go in peace, be warmed and filled,’ without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that?” (James 2:15–16). True faith moves beyond words into action. Prayer is essential, but prayer that does not lead to loving service falls short of God’s design. As we lift up those who are less fortunate, we must also ask how God might use us as part of His answer.

One powerful biblical example of caring for a neighbor is found in the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25–37). When a man is beaten and left for dead, religious leaders pass him by. But a Samaritan—considered an outsider—stops, tends the man’s wounds, provides transportation, and pays for his care. Jesus concludes by saying, “You go, and do likewise” (Luke 10:37). This story reminds us that love is not limited by convenience, background, or comfort. It is sacrificial, costly, and deeply compassionate.

Why is this so important for the church today? Because the world is watching how we live out what we proclaim. Acts of mercy authenticate the message of the gospel. When we care for the hurting, we display the character of Christ, who emptied Himself in the form of a servant, he became poor for our sake so that we might become rich in Him (2 Corinthians 8:9). The church is meant to be a visible testimony of God’s kingdom to the world—one where no one is forgotten and no need is ignored.

This winter, let Christ’s church serve and pray. Pray for families facing financial strain, for those experiencing homelessness, and for the elderly who feel isolated. Ask God to open our eyes to needs around us and to soften our hearts toward those who suffer. Consider practical ways to help: donating warm clothing, contributing to food drives, checking on neighbors, or supporting local outreach ministries.

May our church be known as a place where the love of Christ is not only preached but practiced. As we extend warmth to others, may they encounter the greater warmth of God’s grace—and may His name be glorified through it all.

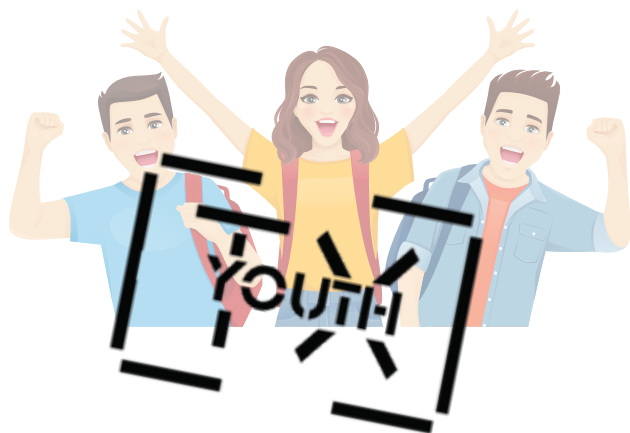

You don't want to miss this!!

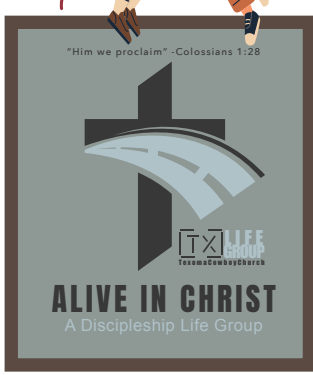
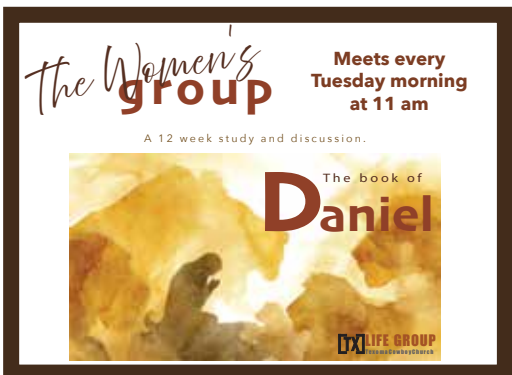

Youth Ride Tuesday nights from 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm. Horseback riding lessons for all ages.

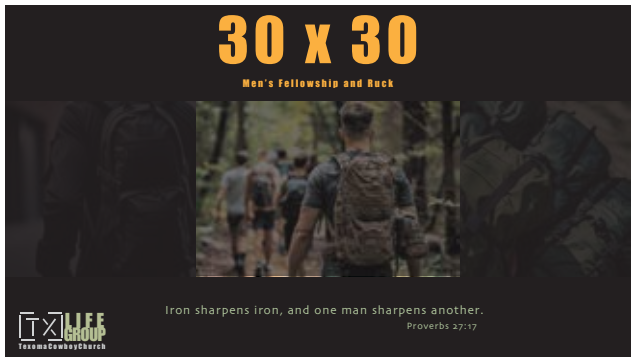
Adult rides 6:00 - 8:00 pm on the first Tuesday of the month.

Don't have a horse of your own? Not a problem. We will provide you with a horse to ride.

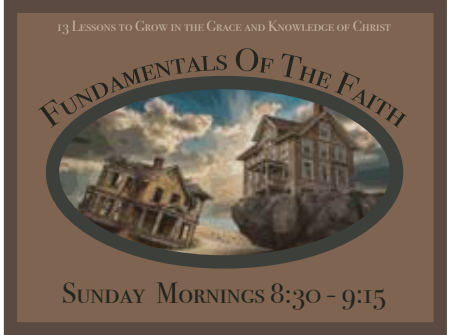
Bring your Bible!

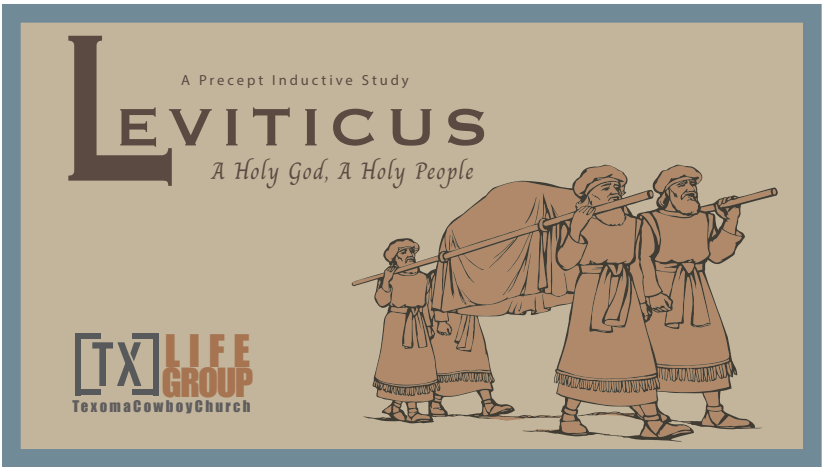

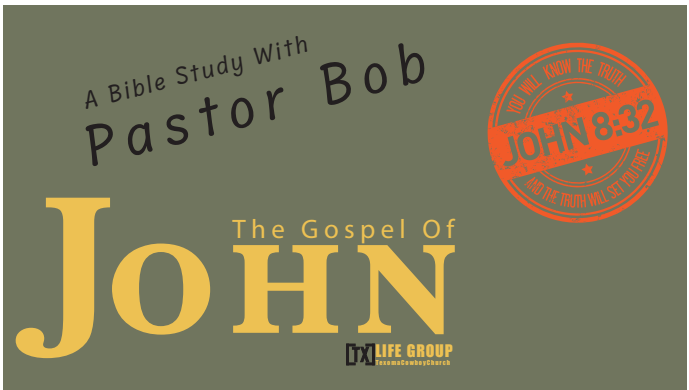
