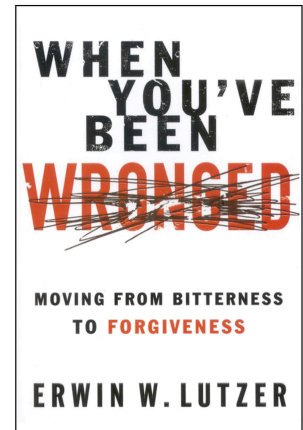

What do Elders do?

In the Old Testament, elders were primarily appointed by Divine instruction, with God commending Moses to select them to help lead the Israelites. Elders served as judges and leaders for the people, as their authority was derived from God and empowered by His Spirit. Moses chose seventy elders, as he was a direct agent of God's.

Today, at Chapel of the Cross we have approximately fourteen elders who reside on the committee, who have been assigned a flock of 65-70 members. The elders assist the pastor by calling their flock and reporting information that might be relevant.

What else do elders do at Chapel of the Cross? The elders attend 10 meetings a year and turn in written reports generally every month. Elders assist with baptisms, Holy Communion, and some funerals. You will also find elders serving on church committees, ushering, choir, Advent and Lenten dinners, maintenance projects, and grass cutting. You may see our elders attending other events such as Bible Study, funerals, and the Chapel travelers.

Did you know that an elder on Sunday morning from 10:45-11:00 am will be in the small Chapel praying for health concerns of Chapel family members and friends? You are welcome to join in and pray for your family.

Elders are often thanked and have received cards to show appreciation for their service. It is said that 90% of a church's needs are performed by 10% of the members and you will generally find some elders in this group.

To become an elder, you must be a male member of Chapel of the Cross. If you feel God calling you to serve as an elder, please contact Pastor Laesch at 314-741-3737. I hope you have a better understanding of what an elder does at Chapel of the Cross. †††

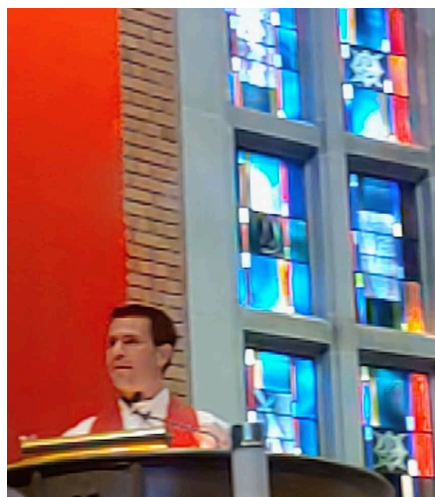
