Big Idea: Belong and Become

Ice Breaker: What's something you loved at age 4 that would be a little concerning if you still loved it the same way today?

Key Points

Take a few minutes to review the key points from this week's sermon.

- Looking back helps us make necessary changes and adjustments in life
- We are meant to change – this is a healthy part of growth
- The main reason CAC exists is to see people accept Jesus as Savior
- God is at work in us and through us at CAC, and each of us has a role to play in the vision of CAC
- Trusting relationships are the soil where faith grows
- No matter where we are on our spiritual journey, we can develop a stronger faith and deeper love for God
- God wants us to become all that He has designed us to be

Discussion Questions

Based on the sermon, discuss the questions below.

- What was your biggest takeaway? What stuck out the most or moved you on a personal level?
- Did anything bother you? What questions did you have?

Making it Personal

Review with your group the impact this week's sermon made on you personally.

- What was a favorite club, team, group, or organization you belonged to? Why?
- Think about a time you walked into a new environment. What made you feel welcome — or unwelcome? How can you apply that insight at church?
- The sermon emphasized looking in the “rearview mirror.” What is one thing from the past year that you clearly see God doing in your life?
- What was one of your first deepest trusting relationships? How did it impact you?
- Since coming to faith, how have you seen God change and grow you? What changes are most visible to others and what growth has been more hidden but deeply real for you?
- As you look honestly at your life now, where do you see fruit, and where might God be inviting you to further growth?

Scripture Review

Revisit some of the scripture passages from this week and discuss the questions below.

- Psalm 77:11-12 - What should we remember and how can this strengthen our faith during difficult times?
- Ephesians 4:11-13 - What is the stated goal of building up the body of Christ?

Diving Deeper

Use the verses below to dive into other passages of scripture that relate to the primary scripture passage from this week's sermon.

- **Old Testament:** Isaiah 43:18-19, Psalm 103:1-5, Genesis 12:1-2, Genesis 17:3-7, Deuteronomy 7:6, Ecclesiastes 3:1
- **New Testament:** 1 Corinthians 12:12-27, Ephesians 2:19, Ephesians 1:5, Ephesians 4:22-24, Romans 8:15-16, Romans 12:2, Philippians 1:6, Hebrews 10:24-25

How do these scripture passages align with the scripture from the sermon? Do you see any contradictions between passages? If so, can you explain why this is?

Application & Action

It is important to take the knowledge you gain and see how it can become an actionable step that the Holy Spirit can use to produce transformation in your life.

- **Listening to and Walking with Jesus:** In 1 Corinthians 3:6-7 Paul reminds us that each person plays a part, but God is the one who brings the growth. As you reflect on your life right now, where do you sense Jesus inviting your attention or participation in what He is already doing among us at CAC?
- **Anchoring in His Word:** Psalm 115:1 and Revelation 4:11 remind us God alone deserves glory for all He has done. As you reflect on these verses, where have you seen God's goodness or faithfulness in your own life or in the life of our church family? How does noticing this deepen your love for Him and your desire to belong to His community?
- **Leaning on His People:** If trusting relationships are the soil where faith grows, where might God be inviting you to lean in more to relationships you already have? Is there someone you know, even if you're not very close, with whom you might explore a deeper, trusting connection? What might a first step toward that look like?
- **Growing in His Likeness:** A study cited in the message indicated 30% of adults experience loneliness at least weekly. As you think about the people around you, who might be lonely or looking for a place to belong? What could a small, simple step look like for you this week to reflect Jesus' love to them?
- **Action Step:** Looking back at your reflections from today, what is the one step that stands out most as a way you could fully embrace the vision of Belong and Become? What is one small way you could take that step this week? If you feel comfortable, share it with your group for encouragement.

Two-minute Takeaway

In response to this week's message, commit to taking two minutes each day to take a step closer to God.

Practice Being Welcoming:

- **Pause for 60 seconds:** Ask God to open your eyes to someone around you today who might need encouragement, a smile, or a small act of welcome.
- **Notice intentionally for 60 seconds:** Look for opportunities in your day - someone new at church, a coworker, a neighbor, a classmate - anyone you encounter who might feel unseen.

Optional next step (if God prompts you):

- Offer a simple word of encouragement, a greeting, or a listening ear.
- Reflect briefly at the end of the day: "Where did I notice God at work in welcoming someone, or in letting someone welcome me?"
