Message Title: "The Rock That Became a Mountain"

Key Passage: Daniel 2:31–45

Main Message

In Daniel 2, Nebuchadnezzar saw an intimidating statue representing the kingdoms of this world – but it was ultimately shattered by a mysterious rock, cut without human hands. That rock is Jesus Christ – divine, not of this creation, sent from heaven and born of a virgin by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Unlike kingdoms made by man, Christ’s kingdom is eternal. His blood is not ordinary; it is the very blood of God, powerful to save, cleanse, and redeem. The church, built on this Rock, is destined not for defeat but for victory. No matter what collapses in the world around us, the mountain of the Lord – His church – will stand and grow until it fills the earth.

Discussion Questions

- 1. What does it mean that Jesus is the “rock cut without hands”?**
- 2. Why is it important that Jesus was not born of man but conceived by the Holy Spirit?**
- 3. How does Daniel’s vision show the difference between worldly power and God’s eternal kingdom?**
- 4. How should Christ’s victory shape the way we live in today’s chaotic world?**
- 5. In what areas of your life do you need to remember that the church is victorious?**

Key Takeaways
