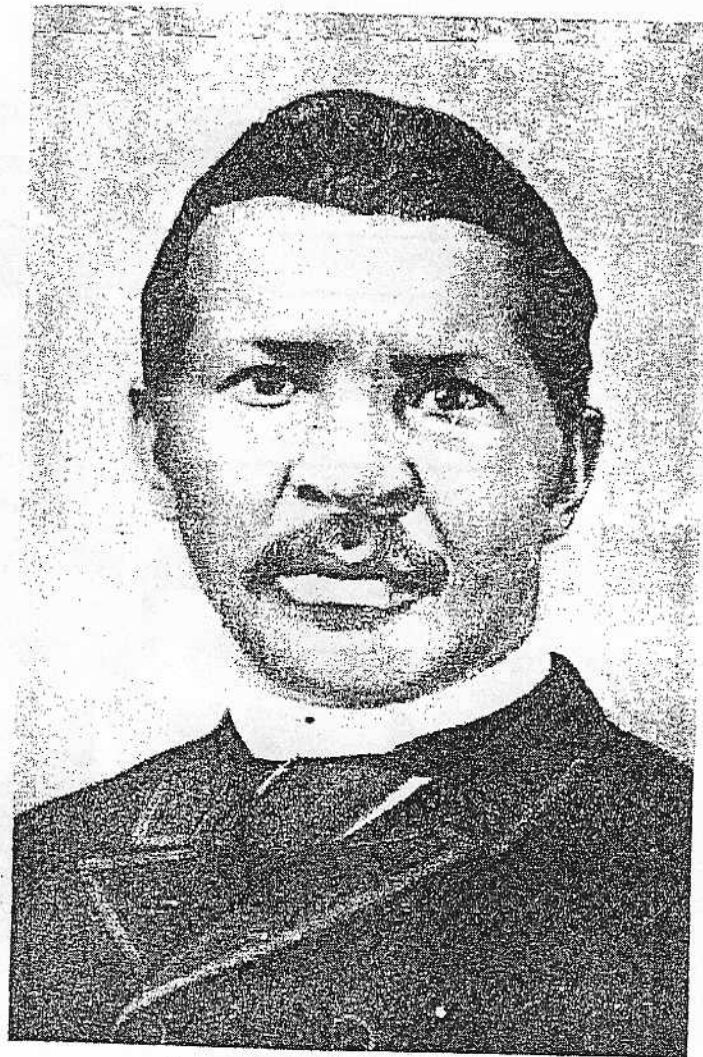

Rev. Benjamin F. Granade
1873 - 1882

In 1873 Springfield was born with the organization by a small band of Christian workers: these were Rev. Benjamin F. Granade, Dea. Horace Taylor, Brother Lee Wellmaker, Sister Mary Taylor along with Rev. Ellington and Mr. Stockton of the caucasian Baptist Church. They felt this meaning for Springfield : "Spring" meant the head, the beginning of a great stream, never still, continuing to rise and go! "Field" meant, of course, a plant bed, where we draw the tender plants and start them off to grow. The first church building was a small structure which once had served as a school called Columbia Institute. Rev. Granade and followers secured this building from its owner, Mr. Dock Smith, for \$250.00. Later, 3/4 acre of land was bought on which a hiproof building was constructed with an addition of two more acres. Brother Ed Smith was licensed to preach during Rev. Granade's pastorate. After nine years of faithful leadership, Rev. Granade was called to this heavenly home.



Rev. Gad S. Johnson
1883 - 1892

In 1883 a new Shepherd was called - the Rev. Gad S. Johnson. As the church continued to grow, the small structure was replaced by a larger one with a Pulpit set purchased. Brothers Sip Taylor, Henry Davis, and Mike Lazenby were licensed to preach. Deacons serving during both Rev. Granade's and Rev. Johnson's ministries were: Brothers Allen Hollimon, Jow Dorsey, Joshua Jones, Blandon Dill, Jordan Shanks, Jessie Shanks, West Paschal, Ples Showers, and Horace Taylor. After nine years, the Pulpit became vacant.



Rev. J. W. Whitehead
1893 - 1938

Again in 1893 God worked in a wonderful way in giving us the leader, Rev. J. W. Whitehead. In addition to the spiritual growth, other improvements made included the placing of a large window in the center front, purchase of an Organ and Piano, and building of a Choir stand for Choir, and chairs with some carpeting. The Sunday School and BYPU were organized and served as host for the State Convention in 1912. Brothers Willie Harmon and Henry Showers were licensed to preach. Deacons ordained were: Brothers Sidney Shank, Peter Richard, Franklin Shank, John Winfrey, Patron Bullard, Ples Showers, Ephriam Dunn, John Bell, Augustus Shanks and Albert Demons. Deacons coming from other churches were: Brothers Frank West, John McElroy, Charlie Bens, J. D. White, and Emanuel Dorsey. After almost 45 years of service in 1938, Rev. Whitehead kept a date with his master.



REV. J. H. West
1938 - 1983

In keeping with his wishes, a son of Springfield, who was sanctioned as Assistant Pastor, was placed in charge a month after Rev. Whitehead's passing. After serving in such role for almost two years, Rev. West was installed as Pastor on March 14, 1940. New spiritual emphasis included the changing of Sunday School from afternoon to morning sessions, reinstating the June revival, expanding worship from one-Sunday a month to every-Sunday, with many added to the christian fold. After a life given to God and man and serving as Pastor of Springfield for 45 years, Rev. West was called to his heavenly home on August 16, 1983, followed by the funeral that placed his body on the church grounds in loving memory and appreciation. To continue his serving, The J. H. West Scholarship Fund in his memory was begun with approx. \$3,000.00 now and growing. During Rev. West's leadership Brothers Jacob Bentley, Tommy Burgess, Jr., and Wallace Massey were licensed to preach. Brother Jacob Bentley was ordained as a minister. Deacons ordained were: Brothers J. B. Demons, Isaac Demons, Ronnie Norris, Carvee N. West, John H. West, Harrison Brinson, Walter Jones, Johnnie Murray, H. E. Dean, E. G. Long, Sr., Tom West, Rob Willie Shields, Roy Pettis, Charlie Lowe, John Jackson, R. L. Norris, Marion Paschall, George T. Drake, Joseph D. Greene, Alton Petett, Johnnie Walker, John A. Bowman, Eugene Brinson, James Isom, Henderson Roberson, Sr., Tommy Burgess, Jr., Tommy Burgess, Sr., and Otis Jenkins. Deacons coming from other churches were: Brothers A. T. Wilson, S. M. Dagget, J. D. White, E. V. Petett, and James Lamar.



Rev. F. D. Favors
1984 -

In 1984 after more than a year without a Leader-Shepherd God worked in a wonderful way in giving us the Leader, Rev. Frederick D. Favors on 1 October. Rev. Favors Installation Service was held on 25 November. New spiritual emphasis includes: instituting a Christmas Day Prayer-Breakfast, forming of the following Committees of Groups: Tutorial, Cultural, New Members, Medical Awareness, Evangelism Department, and Photography; for wider involvement Male Chorus formed; new role for Visitation Committee includes distributing monthly Love Gift to our sick & shut-in members; support of a Prison Ministry, instituted weekly Bible study; and full time Secretary-Clerk added. 42 members added to the christian fold with 30 by Baptism, and 12 by Christian Experience. In 1986, 13 new members were Baptized, 6 joined by Christian Experience, and 1 under Watchcare. Church Van purchased, annual Educastional Program instituted, first group of people were trained using the Evangelistic Task Force Model, sponsoring of a Girl Scout Troop. Sis. Gussie Brinson was crowned as "Mrs. Springfield" in Operation '86. Dedicatory service for the Dean-West Education Center and the J. H. West Fellowship Hall held on July 13, starting of our Deapartmentalized Sunday School on August 31, and Sis. Mary Johnson assigned to work with the Youth Choir which has shown a vast increase under her leadership. Since our last Anniversary, 32 new members were Baptized, 8 joined by Christian Experience, and 5 by Letter. Springfield was host for the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Inc. Regional Mini-Congress for Districts 1, 6, 8, & 10 on March 26. Our church paper name was changed on September 1 from the "Fellowship Echoes" to "The Springfield Voice". In our effort to reach out and serve people, 14 of our Mission in Action ladies were trained as Resource Mothers to form a McDuffie County Mother-to-Mother Program with Springfield being selected as contact point for this area by CONTINUUM, Alliance for Healthy Mothers and Children, a state-wide non-profit organization, and organing of "The Amazing Grace Choir for members 55 and older and others interested in gospel singing on October 3.

HISTORY OF SPRINGFIELD MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH

THE LORD HAS BEEN GOOD TO US!

IN THE SPIRIT OF GRATITUDE TO OUR HEAVENLY FATHER BY WHOSE FAVOR, INSPIRATION AND GUIDANCE WE HAVE COME TO THE 128TH ANNIVERSARY OF THIS CHURCH. WE HAVE HEARTS FILLED WITH GRATITUDE AND PRAISE FOR THE WAY OUR CHURCH HAS BEEN RAISED UP AND BLESSED IN THIS COMMUNITY. IN LOVE FOR OUR BELOVED CHURCH AND IN REVERENT MEMORY OF ALL THOSE WHO BY SERVICE DOWN THROUGH THE YEARS HAVE BEQUEATHED TO US THIS VALUABLE CHURCH AND PROPERTY, WE COME TO THOSE MOMENT OF SHARING WITH YOU OUR HISTORY WITH GRATEFUL APPRECIATION. WE DO THIS REMEMBERING THE SACRIFICES OF THE FATHERS, UPON WHOSE FOUNDATIONS WE ARE BUILDING.

IN 1873 SPRINGFIELD WAS BORN WITH THE ORGANIZATION BY A SMALL BAND OF CHRISTIAN WORKERS. THESE WERE REV. BENJAMIN F. GRANADE, DEA. HORACE TAYLOR, BROTHER LEE WELLMAKER, SISTER MARY TAYLOR ALONG WITH REV. ELL ELLINGTON AND MR.. STOCKTON OF THE CAUCASIAN BAPTIST CHURCH. THEY FELT THIS MEANING FOR SPRINGFIELD: "SPRING: MEANT THE HEAD, THE BEGINNING OF A GREAT STREAM, NEVER STILL, CONTINUING TO RISE AND GO! "FIELD" MEANT, OF COURSE, A PLANT BED, WHERE WE DRAW THE TENDER PLANTS AND START THEM OFF TO GROW. THE FIRST CHURCH BUILDING WAS A SMALL STRUCTURE WHICH ONCE HAD SERVED AS A SCHOOL CALLED COLUMBIA INSTITUTE. REV. GRANADE AND FOLLOWERS SECURED THIS BUILDING FROM ITS OWNER, MR.. DOCK SMITH, FOR \$250.00. LATER 3/4 ACRES OF LAND WAS BOUGHT ON WHICH A HIROOF BUILDING WAS CONSTRUCTED WITH AND ADDITION OF TWO MORE ACRES. BROTHER ED SMITH WAS LICENSED TO PREACH DURING REV. GRANADE'S PASTORATE. AFTER NINE YEARS OF FAITHFUL LEADERSHIP, REV. GRANADE WAS CALLED TO HIS HEAVENLY HOME.

IN 1883 A NEW SHEPHERD WAS CALLED - THE REV. GAD S. JOHNSON. AS THE CHURCH CONTINUED TO GROW, THE SMALL STRUCTURE WAS REPLACED BY A LARGER ONE WITH A PULPIT SET PURCHASED. BROTHERS SIP TAYLOR, HENRY DAVIS, AND MIKE LAZENBY WERE LICENSED TO PREACH. DEACONS SERVING DURING BOTH REV. GRANADE'S AND REV. JOHNSON'S MINISTRIES WERE: BROTHERS ALLEN HOLLIMON, JOW DORSEY, JOSHUA JONES, BLANDON DILL, JORDAN SHANKS, JESSIE SHANKS, WEST PASCHAL, PLES SHOWERS, AND HORACE TAYLOR. AFTER NINE YEARS, THE PULPIT BECAME VACANT.

AGAIN IN 1893 GOD WORKED IN A WONDERFUL WAY IN GIVING US THE LEADER, REV. J. W. WHITEHEAD. IN ADDITION TO THE SPIRITUAL GROWTH, OTHER IMPROVEMENTS MADE INCLUDED THE PLACING OF A LARGE WINDOW IN THE CENTER FRONT, PURCHASE OF AN ORGAN AND PIANO, AND BUILDING OF A CHOIR STAND FOR CHOIR, AND CHAIRS WITH SOME CARPETING. THE SUNDAY SCHOOL AND BYPU(BAPTIST

YOUNG PEOPLE UNION) WERE ORGANIZED AND SERVED AS HOST FOR THE STATE CONVENTION IN 1912. BROTHERS WILLIE HARMON AND HENRY SHOWERS WERE LICENSED TO PREACH.. DEACONS ORDAINED WERE: BROTHERS SHOWERS, EPHRAIM DUNN, JOHN BELL, AUGUSTUS SHANKS, AND ALBERT DEMONS. DEACONS COMING FROM OTHER CHURCHES WERE: BROTHERS FRANK WEST, JOHN MCELROY, CHARLIE BENS, J.D. WHITE, AND EMANUEL DORSEY. AFTER ALMOST 45 YEARS OF SERVICE, IN 1938, REV. WHITEHEAD KEPT A DATE WITH HIS MASTER.

IN KEEPING WITH HIS WISHES, A SON OF SPRINGFIELD, WHO WAS SANCTIONED AS ASSISTANT PASTOR, WAS PLACED IN CHARGE A MONTH AFTER REV. WHITEHEAD'S PASSING. AFTER SERVING IN SUCH ROLE FOR ALMOST TWO YEARS, REV. J. H. WEST WAS INSTALLED AS PASTOR ON MARCH 14, 1940. NEW SPIRITUAL EMPHASIS INCLUDED THE CHANGING OF SUNDAY SCHOOL FROM AFTERNOON TO MORNING SESSIONS, REINSTATING THE JUNE REVIVAL, EXPANDING WORSHIP FROM ONE SUNDAY A MONTH TO TWICE A MONTH, WITH MANY ADDED TO THE CHRISTIAN FOLD. DURING REV. WEST'S LEADERSHIP BROTHER JACOB BENTLEY WAS ORDAINED AS A MINISTER. DEACONS ORDAINED WERE: BROTHERS J. B. DEMONS, ISAAC DEMONS, RONNIE NORRIS, CARVEE N. WEST, JOHN H. WEST (BUS), HARRISON BRINSON, WALTER JONES, JOHNNIE MURRAY, H.E. DEAN, E.G. LONG, SR., TOM WEST, ROB WILLIE SHIELDS, ROY PETTIS, CHARLIE LOWE, JOHN JACKSON, R. L. NORRIS, MARION PASCHALL, GEORGE T. DRAKE, JOSEPH GREENE, ALTON PETETT, JOHNNIE WALKER, JOHN A. BOWMAN, EUGENE BRINSON, HENDERSON ROBERSON, SR., JAMES ISOM, TOMMY BURGESS, JR., TOMMY BURGESS, SR. AND OTIS JENKINS. DEACONS COMING FROM OTHER CHURCHES WERE: BROTHERS A. T. WILSON, S. M. DAGGETT, J. D. WHITE, E. V. PETETT AND JAMES LAMAR.

OUR TIME LINE OF IMPROVEMENT

1940-1944 - NEW STOVES, REPAIR OF CHURCH, PURCHASE OF BAPTIZING SUIT, MATRON CLUB ORGANIZED, USHER BOARD REVIVED, OTHER DEPARTMENTS ENLARGED WITH MATRON CLUB DIRECTING THE CARPETING AND HANGING OF MIRRORS IN EACH VESTIBULE. THE BAPTIST TRAINING UNION (BTU) BROUGHT 18 CHAIRS. AN ANNEXATION CONSISTING OF CHOIR STAND BEHIND THE PULPIT, INDOOR POOL, WITH ROOMS FOR CHOIRS, USHERS, DEACONS AND PASTOR'S AREA.

1946 - MONTHLY CHURCH BULLETIN INITIATED WITH SIS. CLARA WEST AS EDITOR (MINIMUM EQUIPMENT PROVIDED BY CHURCH).

1948 - BRICK STEPS PLACED AT FRONT ENTRANCES WITH AN ART WINDOW PROJECT SPONSORED BY THE TRUSTEE BOARD AT A COST OF \$1,415.00 WITH DEDICATION ON THE FIRST SUNDAY IN AUGUST. THE COURTESY GUILD AND WOMAN'S COUNCIL WERE ORGANIZED AND SPONSORED A SUMMER WEEKLY STORY HOUR FOR 6 WEEKS AND A DAILY VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL WITH AN ENROLLMENT OF 130 PUPILS AND 15 STAFF MEMBERS. THIRTY(30) CHILDREN COMMITTED THEMSELVES TO CHRIST!

1951 - A PULPIT BIBLE WAS PURCHASED BY SISTER ROBBIE DEMONS FOR \$35.00. a CIRCULAR ART WINDOW PLACED IN THE FRONT OF THE CHURCH FOR \$700.00. BETWEEN THE TWO ENTRANCES - ONE USED FOR MEN - THE OTHER FOR WOMEN. THE SENIOR CHOIR PURCHASED BAPTIST HYMNALS. A TITHING PROGRAM OF GIVING WAS BEGUN.

1956 - TWO WINDOW FANS PURCHASED WITH THE FUNDS RAISED IN A DRIVE LED BY SISTER MARY LOWE. LATER A NEW WATER COOLER WAS BOUGHT BY THE PULPIT AID CLUB AND SIX GAS HEATERS BY THE CHURCH.

1957-'58 - BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT COMPLETED AT A COST OF \$1,500.00 WITH THE DEACONESS, DEACON AND TRUSTEE BOARDS SHARING THE PAINTING. THE EDUCATIONAL BUILDING WAS ALMOST COMPLETED, WITH HOT WATER HEATER AND 200 CHAIRS PURCHASED BY CHURCH, A GAS HEATER GIVEN BY THE DOZIER PLUMBING COMPANY, A PIANO BY THE MATRON'S CLUB WITH A PORTION OF PAINTING DOWNSTAIRS BY DEACONESS BOARD, THE SUNDAY SCHOOL AND SOUVENIR PROGRAM COMMITTEE. THE AS-YOU-LIKE-IT COMMUNITY CLUB, MRS. MAMIE FLOURMOY, PRESIDENT, PLACED A NEW FRIGIDAIRE, AND DEACON ALBERT DEMONS LED A PROJECT TO PLACE AN ELECTRIC WATER COOLER IN THE EDUCATION BUILDING.

1963-'72 - A SMALL P. A. SYSTEM GIVEN BY THE YOUTH DEPARTMENT. A NEW PIANO BOUGHT AND ORGAN INSTALLED. IN 1965, THE CHURCH RENOVATION INCLUDED A FRONT CENTRAL ENTRANCE, BRICK VENEERING, CARPETING, NEW PEWS, PULPIT SET, COMMUNION TABLES AND CHAIRS, PANEL FOR CHOIR STAND, NEW CHAIRS, A TITHING CONTAINER, OFFERING PLATES, OUTDOOR BULLETIN BOARD, PLACING INLAID LINOLEUM ON THE FLOOR IN THE EDUCATION BUILDING WITH DEA. E. V. PETETT'S LABOR OF LOVE, AND SHRUBBERY PLACED, CALIFONE RECORD PLAYER WITH 10 STILL PICTURES. IN 1966 THE DEDICATION SERVICE OF "GREATER SPRINGFIELD" WAS HELD IN AUGUST. ON THE FIRST SUNDAY IN JUNE, 1967 THE CHURCH BEGAN ITS EVERY SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE. IN 1970 THE HYMNAL PROJECT RESULTED IN 148 BAPTIST HYMNALS AND A NURSERY WAS BEGUN BY THE DEACONESS BOARD. YOUTH DEPARTMENT ORGANIZED WITH SIS. ROSEINIA CULPEPPER, DIRECTOR.

IN 1970 CONCERNED WITH THE EDUCATION OF OUR YOUTH, THE CHURCH ESTABLISHED A SCHOLARSHIP FUND TO AWARD SCHOLARSHIPS TO STUDENTS IN PURSUIT OF HIGHER EDUCATION. DEACON JOSEPH GREENE WAS NAMED CHAIRMAN, WITH THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS SERVING ON THE COMMITTEE: ROSEZINIA CULPEPPER, DAISY WILSON, DAISY FERRELL, BILLIE DRAKE, DOROTHY LOGAN, JOHNNIE WALKER, LUCILLE PASCHALL, ANN WASHINGTON AND EMMA DAVIS.

1973 - CELEBRATION OF THE SPRINGFIELD CENTENNIAL WITH THE PRESENTATION OF ITS CENTENNIAL JOURNAL - ITS FIRST HISTORICAL PUBLICATION! THE RELOCATION OF REV. GRANADE'S GRAVE TO A PLACE OF SERENITY - OUR FIRST PILGRIMAGE TO HIS GRAVE, WHICH WAS MOVED FROM THE FRONT OF THE CHURCH, DURING OUR ANNIVERSARY. THE LAYING OF THE CORNERSTONE WITH THE MASON PARTICIPATING WITH WORSHIPFUL E. V. PETETT LEADING.

1974-75 - THE ADDITION OF CENTRAL HEATING - AIR CONDITIONING IN BOTH SANCTUARY AND EDUCATION BUILDING. THE FIRST FEED-A-KID AND CULTURAL ENRICHMENT PROGRAM WITH THE EMPLOYMENT OF 5 NEIGHBORHOOD YOUTH CORPS WORKERS AT \$18.00 PER DAY FOR 5 WEEKS WITH DIRECTOR CLARA WEST. THE ORGANIZING OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD. THE BEGINNING OF THE BIRTHDAY GROUPS FOR GREATER "OUTREACH" AND WIDE PARTICIPATION WITH THEIR LEADERSHIP ON EACH SECOND SUNDAY IN EACH MONTH! EACH MONTHLY BIRTHDAY

1956 - TWO WINDOW FANS PURCHASED WITH THE FUNDS RAISED IN A DRIVE LED BY SISTER MARY LOWE. LATER A NEW WATER COOLER WAS BOUGHT BY THE PULPIT AID CLUB AND SIX GAS HEATERS BY THE CHURCH.

1957-'58 - BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT COMPLETED AT A COST OF \$1,500.00 WITH THE DEACONESS, DEACON AND TRUSTEE BOARDS SHARING THE PAINTING. THE EDUCATIONAL BUILDING WAS ALMOST COMPLETED, WITH HOT WATER HEATER AND 200 CHAIRS PURCHASED BY CHURCH, A GAS HEATER GIVEN BY THE DOZIER PLUMBING COMPANY, A PIANO BY THE MATRON'S CLUB WITH A PORTION OF PAINTING DOWNSTAIRS BY DEACONESS BOARD, THE SUNDAY SCHOOL AND SOUVENIR PROGRAM COMMITTEE. THE AS-YOU-LIKE-IT COMMUNITY CLUB, MRS. MAMIE FLOURMOY, PRESIDENT, PLACED A NEW FRIGIDAIRE, AND DEACON ALBERT DEMONS LED A PROJECT TO PLACE AN ELECTRIC WATER COOLER IN THE EDUCATION BUILDING.

TO PROVIDE "SNACKS FOR THE CHILDREN AFTER SUNDAY SCHOOL AND BEFORE MORNING WORSHIP THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD ENCOURAGED THE BEGINNING OF THE MARTHA GROUP WITH SIS. SPRINGFIELD WAS ALSO HOST FOR THE FOURTH SHILOH ASSOCIATION SPONSORED THE FIRST J. H. WEST MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND TO HELP STUDENTS ATTEND SCHOOLS OF HIGHER LEARNING. TWENTY-FOUR MEMBERS HAVE ENTERED THE CHRISTIAN FLOCK. DEACONS ORDAINED: BROTHERS WALDO MASSEY, CURTIS PICKARD, ROBERT SCOTT, MICHAEL THOMAS AND LARRY WILEY.

1993 - SPRINGFIELD WAS HOST FOR THE 122ND ADJOURNED SESSION OF THE GENERAL MISSIONARY BAPTIST CONVENTION OF GEORGIA, INC. NEW OFFICE FURNITURE, FAX MACHINE, CHURCH BUS, AND REFRIGERATOR/FREEZER PURCHASED. PULPIT AID CLUB NAME CHANGED TO THE PASTOR SUPPORTIVE MINISTRY. WEDNESDAY EVENING FAMILY DINNER BEGAN. SPRINGFIELD IN THE PROCESS OF PURCHASING THE WEST HOME FROM SIS. CLARA WEST, WHO AFTER MANY YEARS OF FAITHFUL SERVICE HAS MOVED TO ATLANTA. TWENTY-THREE MEMBERS HAVE ENTERED THE CHRISTIAN FLOCK.

1994 - WEST HOME PURCHASED FROM SIS. CLARA WEST. RESURRECTION COMMUNITY PROGRAM BEGUN TO RECLAIM OUR COMMUNITIES FOR CHRIST. YOUTH DEPARTMENT SPONSORING GIRL SCOUTS. SPRINGFIELD WAS HOST FOR THE FOURTH SHILOH ASSOCIATION JUNE 28-29. FIFTH-THREE MEMBERS HAVE ENTERED THE CHRISTIAN FLOCK. DEACON COMING FROM ANOTHER CHURCH--DEA. BENNIE BENTLEY. PRESENTLY PLANS ARE UNDER WAY TO BUILD A LIMITED CARE HOME. FORTY-SEVEN MEMBERS WERE ADDED.

1995 - IN AN EFFORT TO RECLAIM OUR COMMUNITY, REV. FAVORS LED SEVERAL MEN MARCHES THROUGH THE COMMUNITY. THESE MARCHES WERE TO STAMP OUT DRUGS,

CRIME, VIOLENCE, AND OTHER SINFUL ACTS. ELDERS LEADERSHIP SYSTEM INSTITUTED. THIRTY-ONE MEMBERS HAVE ENTERED THE CHRISTIAN FLOCK. DEACONS ORDAINED: HERMAN COWINS AND JOHNNY REID.

1996 - REV. FAVORS' VISION OF REACHING OUT TO EVERYONE IN NEED OF SPIRITUAL HEALING, LED TO OUR ADDING AN EARLY MORNING SERVICE. THIS 7:45 A.M. SERVICE HAS LED MANY TO CHRIST. NEW VAN PURCHASED, LESLIE SPEAKER PURCHASED TO BE USED WITH ORGAN, NEW ROBES WITH AFRICAN LOOK PURCHASED FOR THE MASS CHOIR, MIRROR AND TABLE PURCHASED FOR VESTIBULE AND FLOWER PEDESTALS FOR SANCTUARY. SUBSTANCE ABUSE MINISTRY INSTITUTED. SIS. GLENNIE OLIVE WAS LICENSED TO PREACH. SIXTY- EIGHT MEMBERS HAVE ENTERED THE CHRISTIAN FLOCK.

1997 - BROTHER CHARLES JONES LICENSED TO PREACH. FIFTY-THREE MEMBERS ADDED.

1998 - PRAYER GARDEN DEDICATED ON DONATED LAND. REV. GLENNIE OLIVE WAS ORDAINED A MINISTER BROTHER ROBERT COBB WAS ORDAINED A DEACON. TWENTY-THREE NEW MEMBERS WERE ADDED.

1999 - BRO. FELTON BRADSHAW WAS LICENSED TO PREACH. TWELVE NEW MEMBERS WERE ADDED.

2000 - 2001 - BROTHERS DAIRIE COLEMAN, EARL COLLINS, BOBBY MOSS AND TREVOR ROBERSON ORDAINED AS DEACONS. BRO. MICHAEL THOMAS LICENSED TO PREACH. INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE CHURCH SANCTUARY AND THE FOUR ROOMS ADJACENT TO IT ALONG WITH THE RELIGIOUS SERVICE CLUB(R. S. C.) WERE RESTORED. THE CEILINGS WERE REPLACED WITH ACOUSTICAL TILE; WALLS WERE COVERED WITH SHEETROCK AND PAINTED; NEW LIGHTS WERE INSTALLED(THREE CHANDELIERS ALONG WITH CEILING FLUORESCENCE); CHANDELIERS WERE PLACED IN THE VESTIBULE. THE FACADE(FRONT) OF THE CHURCH WAS PAINTED; THE RESTROOMS WERE TOTALLY REDONE; THE KITCHEN FLOOR WAS COVERED. MICROPHONES WERE PURCHASED, A 105" X 140' ELECTROL WALL CEILING VIDEO PROJECTION SCREEN WAS PURCHASED, AND A BABY GRAND PIANO. DEA. BENNIE BENTLEY WAS BUILDING SUPERINTENDENT. RENOVATION PROJECT WAS COMPLETED AND A HISTORY EMPHASIS/DEDICATION PROGRAM HELD TO REFLECT UPON THE HISTORY OF THE CHURCH AND PRAISE GOD FOR THE YEARS HE HAS KEPT US. TWENTY-SEVEN MEMBERS WERE ADDED TO THE CHRISTIAN FLOCK.

MS. DOTSIE WILSON SHANK WAS SEXTON (JANITOR) WHO BROUGHT IN COAL; MADE FIRES AND DID EVERYTHING. TWO POT BELLY STOVES FURNISHED HEAT. SHE WORE A BIG WHITE APRON; MADE AND FURNISHED WINE FOR COMMUNION SUPPER.

DEACON JOHN D. WHITE WAS KNOWN FOR BRINGING HIS WAGON LOAD OF ICE AND ICE TEA AND MEMBERS WERE KNOWN FOR BRINGING THEIR TRUNKS OF FOOD ON 3RD SUNDAY IN SEPTEMBER - HOMECOMING.

CONFERENCE WAS HELD QUARTERLY EVERY 3RD SATURDAY AT 3:00 P.M.

A 1936 CONVENTION WAS HELD AT SPRINGFIELD
