PETER PREACHED IN JERUSALEM

Acts 2

The Holy Spirit had come down from heaven and filled Jesus' disciples. When the crowds gathered, they heard the disciples' voices speaking in their own language and did not understand what was going on.

Peter stood up and said, "I'll tell you what's happening." He reminded the people of something the prophet Joel had said long ago: "God says, 'I will pour out My Spirit on all people ... Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'"

Peter said, "Even though God planned for Jesus to die, you used lawless people to nail Him to a cross and kill Him. But death did not keep hold of Jesus; God raised Jesus back to life from the dead."

Then Peter said, "You have seen the truth: Jesus is alive! He went up to heaven to be with God the Father."

When the people heard Peter's words, they felt very sorry.

Peter told the people to repent, to turn away from their sins and to turn to God. "God will forgive your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Be baptized in the name of Jesus," he said.

Everyone who believed Peter's message was baptized. They learned what Jesus' disciples taught, broke bread together and prayed. And every day, more and more people were saved.

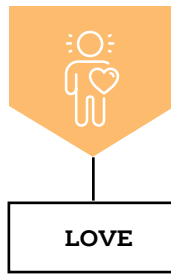

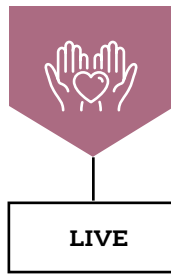

Acts 3

One afternoon, two of Jesus' followers—Peter and John—went to the temple to pray. They saw a man sitting by the temple gate called Beautiful. Every day, the man's friends carried him to the temple because the man could not walk. As people entered the temple, the man asked them for money since he couldn't work.

When the man saw Peter and John, he asked them for money. The man looked at Peter and John, expecting them to give him something.

Peter said, "I don't have any silver or gold for you, but I will give you what I do have." Then Peter said, "In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, get up and walk!"

All of a sudden, the man's feet and ankles were strong. He could walk! In fact, the man jumped and leaped around! He went into the temple, and he praised God. The people in the temple saw that the man

was healed, and they were filled with awe at what had happened to him.

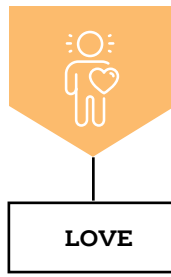

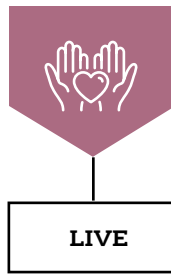

PETER CONTINUED TO PREACH

Acts 4

Peter and John were at the temple. Peter had healed a man and was preaching. The religious leaders came up to them. They were annoyed that Peter was teaching about Jesus, so they put Peter and John in jail until the next day. Still, many of the people who heard their message believed in Jesus and were saved.

The next day, the religious leaders got together along with the high priest and his family. Peter and John stood before them, and they asked, “By what power or in what name have you been healing and teaching?”

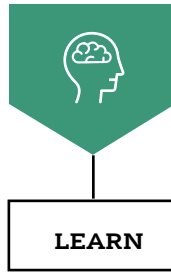
Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit. We want you and all the people of Israel to know that he was healed by the power of Jesus. You nailed Jesus to a cross, but God raised Him from the dead. It is because of Him that this man is healed!”

The religious leaders were amazed, and they didn’t know what to say. They

ordered Peter and John to never preach or teach in the name of Jesus again.

Peter and John said, “We cannot be quiet. We must tell people about what we have seen and heard.” The religious leaders had no reason to punish Peter and John, so they let them go. Peter and John met with other believers and prayed that God would give them power to speak boldly and without fear.

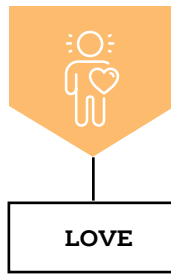

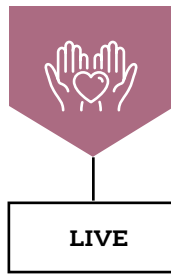

PETER CONFRONTED SIN

Acts 4-5

A large group of believers met together in Jerusalem. They shared everything they had. If someone had more than he needed, he gladly gave it away so everyone had what he needed. One man, Barnabas, sold a field and gave the money to the apostles. The apostles used the money to help people in need.

Ananias and his wife, Sapphira, sold some land and pretended to give all of the money to the apostles, but they kept some of it for themselves. When Ananias brought the money to the apostles, Peter asked him, “Why are you lying to the Holy Spirit? You could have been honest, but instead you lied—not to us, but to God.” When Ananias heard this, he fell down, died, and was buried.

About three hours later, Sapphira came to the apostles. She did not know what had happened to her husband. Peter asked her, “Is this all the money you got for the land?”

“Yes,” she said. “That’s all of it.”

Peter said, “Why did you and your husband agree to test the Lord?” Then Sapphira fell dead too. Great fear came on everyone in the church and all who heard about these things.

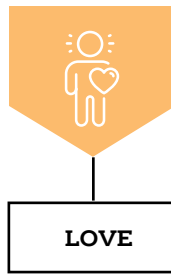

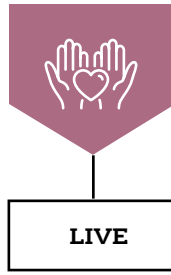

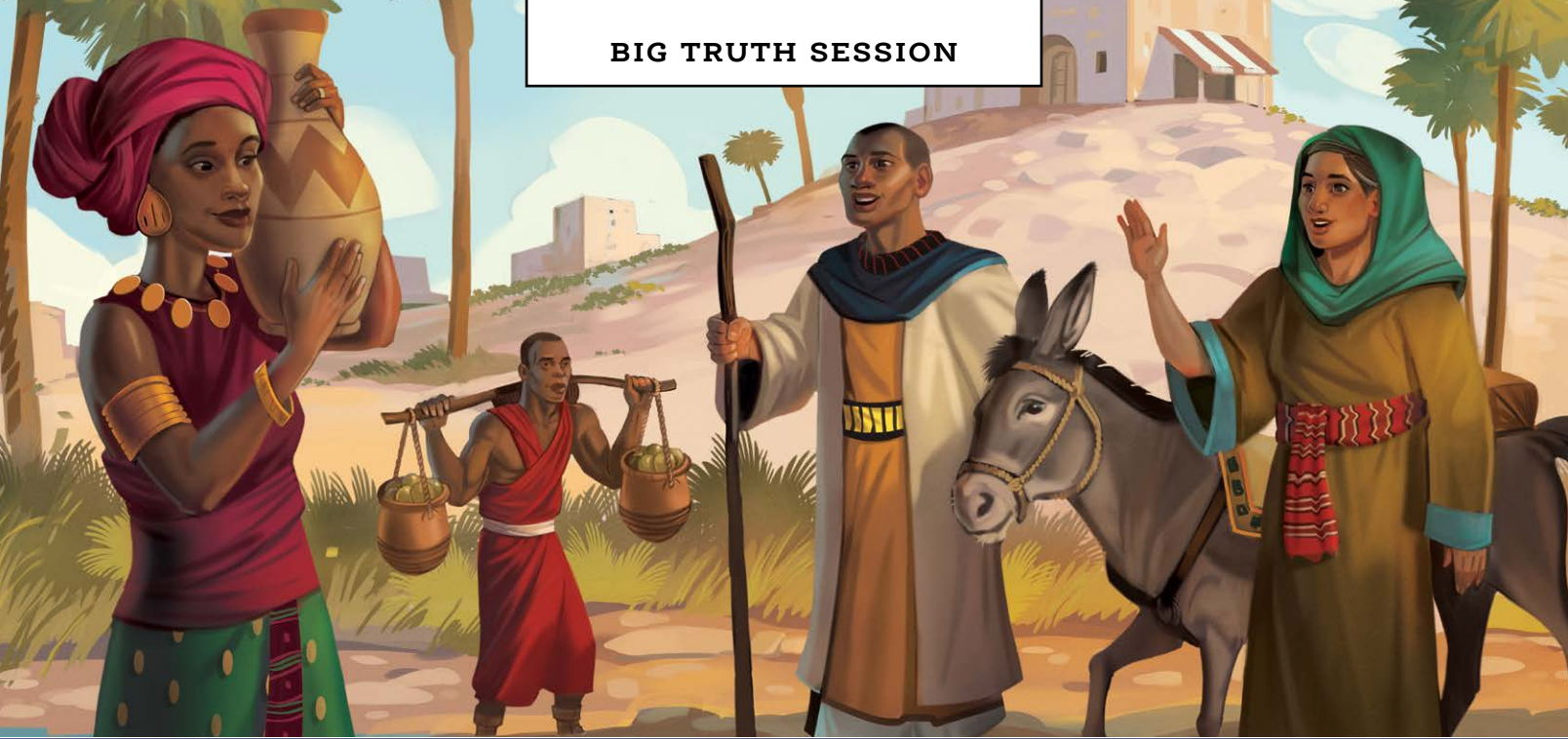

WE ARE TO TELL OTHERS ABOUT JESUS

Romans 10

Paul was a believer whom God sent to tell other people about Jesus. Paul was in Corinth when he wrote a letter to Christians in Rome. Paul's letter to the Romans explains what it means to be a Christian.

In one part of his letter to the Romans, Paul wrote, "Friends, I want the Jews to be saved from their sins. I pray that this would happen. I know they want to please God; they try so hard. But they do not believe that people can only be saved by trusting in Jesus.

"This is the truth we must tell other people: If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

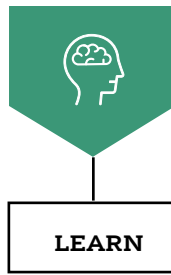
Then Paul explained why it is so important to tell others about Jesus: "Before people can trust in the Lord, they must believe in Him. And before

they can believe in Him, they must hear about Him. And for them to hear about Jesus, someone must tell them. And before someone can go and tell them, that person must be sent."

Paul shared the words spoken by the prophet Isaiah: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news."

Paul said again, "Faith comes from hearing the good news about Jesus, and people hear the good news when we tell them."

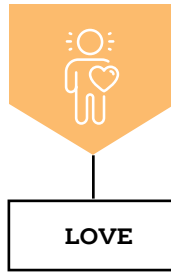

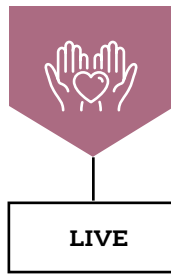
