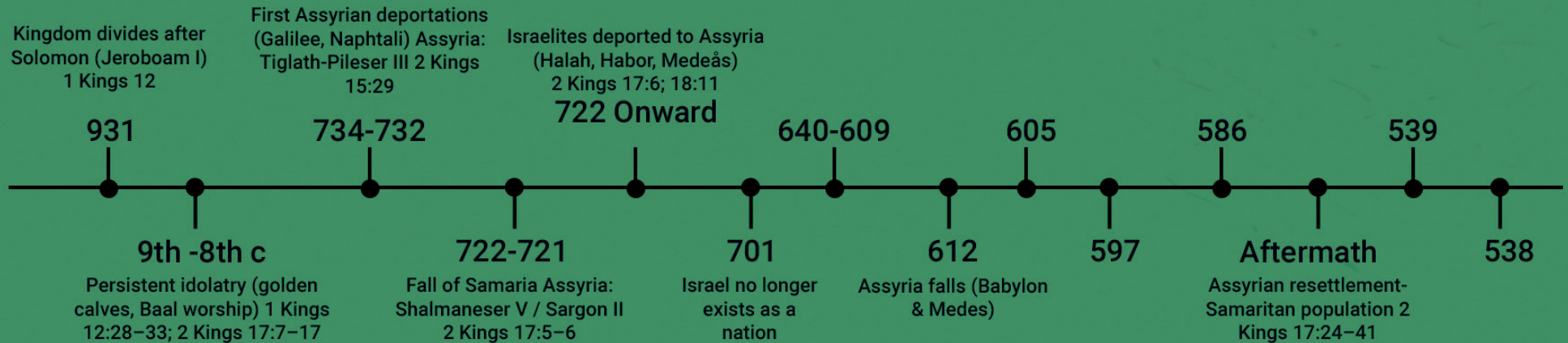

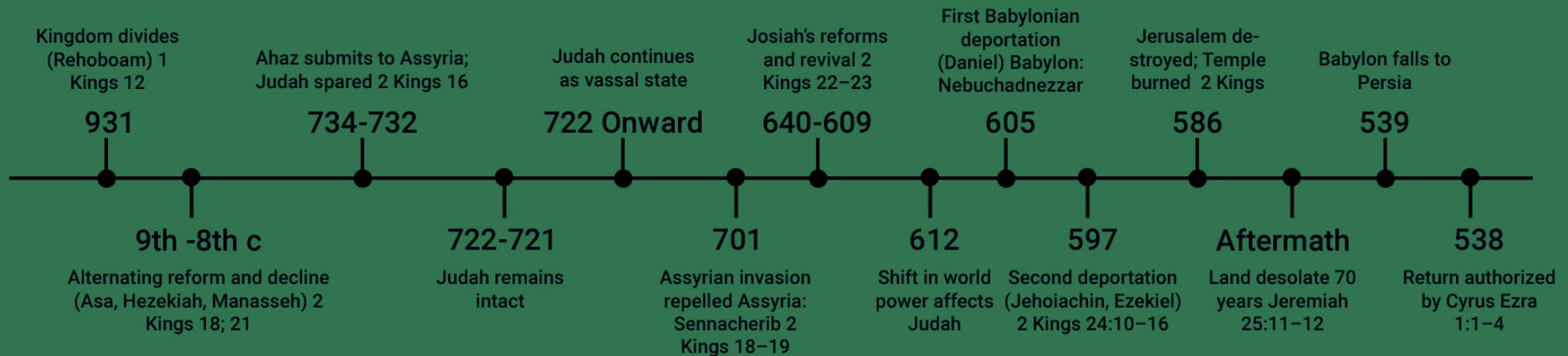
<i>Group</i>	<i>Who They Were</i>	<i>Primary Responsibilities</i>
Priests	Descendants of Aaron	Offer sacrifices, pronounce blessings, teach the Law
Levites	Tribe of Levi (non-Aaronic)	Assist priests, teach the Law, care for Temple furnishings
Singers	Levites from the sons of Asaph	Lead musical worship and praise
Gatekeepers	Levitical families assigned to the gates	Guard Temple entrances, regulate access, protect holiness
Temple Servants	Likely descendants of the Gibeonites (Josh 9)	Manual and logistical labor (wood, water, support)
Sons of Solomon's Servants	Descendants of royal laborers (1 Kgs 9:20-21)	Skilled and support labor

Priests	4,289	10.13%
Levites	74	0.17%
Singers	128	0.30%
Gatekeepers	139	0.33%
Temple Servants (including Solomon's)	392	0.93%
