Mentorship Program with Oak Grove-Bellemeade Elementary Students

One semester commitment; 1-2 hrs./week. Need to complete RPS screening.

Approximately \$40 fee for background check.

October 18 – December 13 (Saturday)

Saturday Literacy each Sat.; 10:00 – 12:30

10:00 – 11:00 Reading and Math activities.

11:00 – 12:30 Outdoors activities

Need 2 adults and high school youth as mentors



November 1 or November 8 (Saturday)

Trinity Meditation Garden

Plant azaleas in this new area of the Park. Trinity members who can't participate might consider a monetary donation to purchase an azalea for planting.

December 13 (Saturday)

Holiday Party for Children

Santa Claus and shopping for Mom's Christmas presents.

Monthly

Conserve and Create Events; 9:00 – 12:00

First Saturday of each month except January and February

Planting native trees, planting fall vegetable garden, spreading wood chips. Volunteers needed during the week from 9:00 – 12:00 to maintain flower and vegetable beds.

Come for segments of one hour during those hours.

Pre-school Field Trips to the Park

September – November and March – May; 9:30 – 12:00 during weekdays.

Spend time with the children in the Rain Garden, Sand Box and Nature areas. Actual dates are established by Richmond Public Schools and Bob Argabright.

Volunteering at GoochlandCares

Our mission is to provide basic human services and health care to our Goochland neighbors in need. GoochlandCares envisions an equitable community in which all persons have their basic needs met, empowering them to lead lives of self-dignity and well-being.

For Individuals:

GoochlandCares welcomes assistance from community volunteers! You can complete a volunteer application and register for volunteer training by going to <https://goochlandcares.org/volunteer/>. You will then be able to choose the days and times you want to volunteer at GoochlandCares via Signup Genius.

Volunteers typically assist clients in the Food Pantry or Clothes Closet, on a weekly basis or according to what the volunteer's schedule permits. Volunteer shifts are 2-3 hours in duration. Duties typically involve welcoming clients, assisting them in selecting items (if needed), helping clients check out with their merchandise, and stocking shelves/racks.

Caring and respectful relationships among GoochlandCares' volunteers, clients, and staff epitomize the organization's motto, "Neighbors Helping Neighbors."

For Groups:

Members of a group from Trinity are not required to complete a volunteer application or volunteer training in order to perform group projects at GoochlandCares. These group projects generally involve little or no contact with clients. Examples of projects that groups from Trinity might undertake include the following:

- On a Saturday or Sunday, a group of volunteers could go to GoochlandCares to sort clothing and other merchandise for the Clothes Closet, or sort food collected in food drives for the Food Pantry. Timing and precise tasks TBD with GoochlandCares staff.
- **Turkey Day.** Each year, the week before Thanksgiving, GoochlandCares offers a drive-through food distribution event in which clients are given a turkey and other supplies to prepare Thanksgiving Dinner in their own homes. GoochlandCares staff and volunteers sometimes survey clients on various questions related to their needs (e.g., Do you need diapers for a baby? If so, what size?), and medical staff sometimes offers a vaccine drive. Trinity could send a contingent of volunteers to participate in this event (probably no more than 10 people). GoochlandCares staff would advise as to needs, time, etc.
- *Luncheon/Brunch/Coffee.* GoochlandCares has started offering periodic luncheons (Chick fil a) and other food/fellowship events with clients to deepen relationships and learn more about clients' needs.

Trinity could provide food/beverages for such an event to be held at the GoochlandCares facility, and perhaps help with set up, serving, name tags, helping clients feel welcome, clean up, etc.

- *Conduct a Food Drive.* Trinity members could collect groceries for GoochlandCares' Food Pantry at any time – or Trinity could choose to coincide with GoochlandCares schedule of food drives (usually held in April). Timing could be worked out with GoochlandCares staff. GoochlandCares publishes a list of most-needed items. Trinity volunteers could also deliver the food they collect to GoochlandCares.
