Laundry coupons can be picked up at Colby's Totally Clean (on Saginaw Rd near the Secretary of State's Office). I'll have a bin to hold any laundry detergent donations, starting Monday, in the Narthex near our good pantry. Please consider a donation to help these residents. 
Next Wednesday, February 25, Ignite will begin with a soup supper at 5:00pm.

The NAMI Middle Michigan Affiliate will be hosting their Family to Family Program beginning Tuesday evenings February 14th thru April 14th. Classes are Virtual, and begin at 6:15 p.m., concluding at 8:45 p.m. each evening.

NAMI Family-to-Family is a free, 8-week educational program for family, significant others and friends of people with mental health conditions. It is a designated evidence-based program. This means that research shows that the program significantly improves the coping and problem-solving abilities of the people closest to a person with a mental health condition.

NAMI Family-to-Family is taught by NAMI-trained family members who have been there, and includes presentations, discussions and interactive exercises.

NAMI Family-to-Family not only provides information and strategies for taking care of the person you love, but you'll also find out that you're not alone. Recovery is a journey, and there is hope!
