### January 8 - Second Sunday after Christmas

### January 14 - Baptism of the Lord

And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." Matthew 3:17

Jesus' baptism inaugurated his mission. We too have been baptized into the mission and ministry of Jesus and we are invited to share his compassion and care with the people of our time.

### January 22 - Second Sunday after Epiphany

When Jesus turned and saw the two disciples following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" John 1:38

What a question! Yes, what are we looking for? Hopefully one thing we're always looking for is the opportunity to be of service to our families, friends and larger community.

### January 29 - Third Sunday after Epiphany

And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." Immediately they left their nets and followed him. Matthew 4:19-20

Part of being a steward is leaving something behind. Maybe that 'something' is time, or money, or convenience, or maybe it's prejudice or a sense of entitlement. We can't expect to grow as stewards without leaving something behind.

Will you remember or forget the Robb Elementary School shooting, the Buffalo, New York supermarket shooting, or the mass shooting in South Carolina mall on Easter weekend?

With an eye on the past, we must also be looking forward to the future. The Psalmist does exactly this in the final two verses of Psalm 73. He writes, "Look! Those who left you are falling apart! Deserters, they'll never be heard from again. But I'm in the very presence of God. Oh, how refreshing it is! Those who are far from you (God) will perish; you destroy all who are unfaithful to you. But as for me, it is good to be near God. I have made the Sovereign LORD my refuge; I will tell of all your deeds." (Psalm 73:27-28 from The Message) Upon finishing his review of the past, the psalmist hammers out a philosophy with which to face the future. No matter what anyone else may do, the Psalmist is resolved to live in close companionship and draw closer to God. He helps us to see the importance of this New Year's resolution by putting it in the form of a contrast:

"Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and establish the work of our hands upon us; yes, establish the work of our hands!" ~ PSALM 90:17

"Those far from You will certainly perish ... but as for me, God's presence is my good." When it comes down to it, there are only two positions in life: close to God or far away from Him. I wonder, as the psalmist penned these words, was something like this going through his mind: "What has caused me so much trouble in in the past and accounted for all my difficulties, was the fact that I did not keep close to God.
