Previously a tax collector. Looked down on by some in the group. Acts as a scribe recording Jesus words and deeds. Eventual author of the Gospel of Matthew.



Simon the Zealot

Devoted to serving God by destroying the enemies of Israel. Has his beliefs challenged when Jesus does a miracle.



Jesse

The invalid at the pool of Bethesda, portrayed as Simon the Zealot's brother. Disabled for 38 years.

Story Background / Cultural Context

Jesus and his disciples have made their way to

Jerusalem for the Festival of Tabernacles. This festival
brings Jews from all over the world to Jerusalem.

Tensions are high with the Pharisees; however, Jesus
knows of a man needing healed at a pagan pool.

The artistic backstory of Simon the Zealot are introduced along with many historically accurate practices of the zealot sect of Judaism.

Discussion Questions

- Which characters stood out to you most? Why?
- What did learn from this episode regarding: Sabbath practices, Festival of Tabernacles, and the zealots?
- John 5:5 tells us that Jesse was disabled for 38 years, what does his presence at the pool say about his desire to be healed?
- What was the stated goal of the zealots? In what ways can passionate people be so wrong about God's Will? (Mark 15:7 was Barrabas a zealot?)
- Jesus tells Jesus that the pool has nothing to offer him, in what ways do we turn to a "pool" instead of Jesus?
- Take time to pray together.
