

6-DAY DEVOTIONAL

ELEVATE | BUILD | SERVE | SEEK

Day 1 – Elevate: Fixing Our Eyes on Jesus

Scripture: *“Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith.” Hebrews 12:2*

Reflection: To elevate Jesus is to give Him first place in our hearts and rhythms. What we consistently focus on shapes who we become. When Christ is central, our worship, decisions, and priorities begin to align around Him. A life that lifts Jesus high quietly invites others to do the same.

Application: Set aside a specific time today to meet with God. Choose a quiet place, open Scripture, and come with a listening posture. Read a short passage, sit in silence for a few moments, and speak honestly with Him in prayer. Let this be less about getting through a routine and more about being present with the One you are elevating.

Day 2 – Build: Growing Together in Faith

Scripture: *“Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds.” Hebrews 10:24*

Reflection: God builds His people in community. Faith deepens as we learn, ask questions, and encourage one another along the way. At its heart, growth is about apprenticing to Jesus—being disciplined by Him as we learn how to follow Him in everyday life. This kind of formation happens over time, shaped through shared life, practice, and obedience.

Application: Set aside time today to reflect on how God has shaped your faith through others. In prayer, thank Him for the people who have encouraged, taught, or walked with you. Ask God to show you one relationship where He may be inviting you to invest more intentionally in shared growth.

Day 3 – Reflect & Act: A Faith That Takes Root

Scripture: *“Do not merely listen to the word, & so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.” James 1:22*

Reflection: Faith grows strongest when it is practiced. What we believe begins to shape how we live, speak, and love. As we respond to God in obedience, we are slowly formed into people who are becoming more like Jesus, not all at once, but over time. A lived-out faith takes root in everyday life and bears fruit through consistency and trust.

Call to Action: Take a few moments to ask God what He has been forming in you recently. In prayer, name one truth or practice He has been drawing your attention to. Ask for the grace to live it out faithfully, trusting that small, consistent steps matter.

Day 4 – Serve: Love Expressed Through Action

Scripture: *“Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others.” 1 Peter 4:10*

Reflection: Serving is an outward expression of inward faith. When we use our gifts to care for others, we reflect the heart of Christ and participate in God’s work in the world. Acts of service, whether seen or unseen, build trust, compassion, and community, and align our hearts more closely with the heart and mission of Jesus.

Application: Spend time in prayer asking God to open your eyes to the needs around you. Listen for where He may be prompting you to respond with compassion. Hold that prompting before Him, asking for willingness and humility as you consider how to serve.

Day 5 – Seek: Intentionally Sharing the Hope of Christ

Scripture: *“How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard?” Romans 10:14*

Reflection: Seeking others means intentionally moving toward those who are far from God. Jesus did not wait to be noticed; He went, spoke, invited, and called people to repentance and new life. Evangelism is not accidental or passive, but a deliberate act of love. When we seek the lost with courage and compassion, we join in God’s mission to bring hope and salvation through the good news of Jesus.

Application: Set aside time today to pray specifically for someone who does not know Christ. Ask God to give you clarity, courage, and love as you consider how and when to speak the gospel clearly and faithfully. Be open to taking a bold step of obedience when the opportunity comes.

Day 6 – Reflect & Act: A Faith That Endures

Scripture *“Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.” Hebrews 13:7*

Reflection: Faith is often passed on quietly—through example, perseverance, and trust in God over time. The way we live today shapes the spiritual legacy we leave behind. A steady, authentic faith invites others to discover that following Jesus is both possible and life-giving.

Call to Action: Create space today to reflect on the kind of faith you are cultivating. In prayer, consider what rhythms or practices are shaping your life over time. Ask God to strengthen what is life-giving and to gently reshape what is not, trusting Him with the legacy your faith leaves behind.
