SUNDAY'S THOUGHT

In Luke 9, Jesus feeds the 5,000 when He blesses then gives the broken pieces to His disciples to distribute. This encourages a mindset of generosity, where our resources, time, and love, when shared, can have a ripple effect far beyond our initial offering.

- Gratitude in Small Things:** Blessing here implies a recognition of God's sovereignty, acknowledging that even the smallest offering can be used mightily when placed in God's hands.
- Embrace Breaking:** Breaking represents a humbling process, where our self-reliance, pride, or a false sense of control is shattered. Through the breaking, God shapes us into vessels that can carry His grace, love, and provision to others.
- Generosity Multiplies:** In our own lives, when we trust God with our resources, talents, and even our brokenness, He will not only use us to meet the needs around us but will overflow blessings back into our lives in ways we could not have imagined.

And He took the five loaves and the two fish, and, looking up to heaven, He blessed them and broke them, and gave them to the disciples again and again, to serve the crowd.


