SUNDAY'S THOUGHT

Kairos is a Greek word that refers to specific moments or opportunities, that are divinely appointed. It contrasts with **chronos**, which denotes mere chronological time.

During these God-provided **Kairos** seasons, we (Believers) must exercise discernment which is the ability to recognize and seize these divinely appointed moments when God acts in a timely and transformative way.

This story 2 Kings 7 and the four Lepers teaches that **Kairos** discernment involves recognizing God's timing and responding in faith rather than doubt. It requires sensitivity to God's movement and a willingness to act decisively when the divine opportunity arises.

Then they said to each other, "What we're doing is not right. This is a day of good news and we are keeping it to ourselves..."


