"The Mission of Visitation House is to provide a safe, secure and caring environment for women during their crisis pregnancy and to prepare women to live as self-sufficient as possible when they leave." (their mission statement was found online).

Founder's information: "Visitation House was a vision by Father Tom Connery, Pastor of [St Peter Catholic Church](#) in Deland Florida. His idea was to create a safe home for women who were pregnant and had few options and nowhere to go. Father Tom Connery presented his church with a challenge to be part of the solution."

- **Tammy Reyes** asked if there was interest to learn about organic long term food preparation and storage. FCW would like to hear more about this topic! There was a brief discussion about how to preserve butter long term (other than freezing). When Tammy returns from her planned travels, she will pursue sharing more at a future meeting.
