Parable of the Sower

'he told them many things in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell along the path, and the birds came and devoured them. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and immediately they sprang up, since they had no depth of soil, but when the sun rose they were scorched. And since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and produced grain, some hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. He who has ears, let him hear."

Matthew 13:3-9

In the Parable of the Sower, Jesus calls us to take our walk with Christ seriously by examining how we hear the Word of God. Hearing matters because true hearing is not just listening—it is understanding and obeying. Scripture calls us to be quick to listen and slow to speak, remaining biblically grounded and discerning whether we are listening to God's truth or the voice of the world.

Parable of the Sower (continued)



True hearing is measured by action. The biblical concept of “Shema” means to hear and to act. The way we hear God’s Word directly impacts how we live. When we truly understand what we hear, it moves us to obedience.

Jesus describes four types of soil that reveal the challenge to true hearing. The shallow soil represents those who are too closed off to receive the Word—it simply bounces off them. The rocky soil represents those who receive the Word with excitement, but fall away when trials come because the Word never takes root. The thorny soil represents those who know the Word and even do good, but allow distractions and idols of the world to choke out God’s truth. The good soil represents those who prepare their hearts, receive the Word, and act on it, producing fruit.

The challenge is personal: What kind of soil are we? And what will we do with the seed of the Gospel that has been planted in our lives? We are called to respond—to cultivate good soil and live out the Word we have heard.


