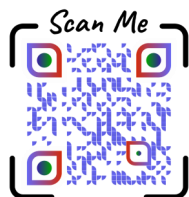

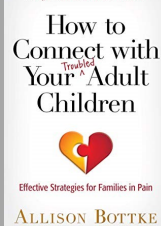

FROM THE PASTOR

Some people only like change when it is jingling in their pockets, but change is evidence of growth and life. Since change is inevitable, we should plan for greatest effect and celebrate every step of the way. I believe some of our best days are ahead of us.

The Preacher, in the book of Ecclesiastes, reminds us, *“There is an occasion for everything, and a time for every activity under heaven.”* I do not think there is a better time than the present to attempt God-sized tasks and watch Him do exceedingly more than we ask (Ephesians 3:20).

As we move toward a new year, there are many tasks which need to be addressed to assure our vision is not derailed. Please pray for our finance committee members as they work diligently to prepare and present a budget that reflects our trust in God and our obedience to His leading.

Additionally, our standing committees and ministry teams need to be reorganized. During the COVID season, we neglected to maintain our committee rotations and we need to take action to be in compliance with our bylaws and to stay in step with our vision.

Likely, we will experience some major changes in our committee structure in order to include broader participation. Our goal is to encourage, equip, and empower all of our members to greater service in the church. For that goal to come to fruition, we will ask some of our current committee members to consider ‘working themselves out of a job’ by training others to help carry the load.

One of the best ways to strengthen ministries and insure healthy church growth is to invest in others. Some of us have served in specific capacities for years and such faithfulness is celebrated. However, as our leadership ages when need to consider how our future will be impacted if we do not begin training new leaders.

Certainly, changes in committee leadership will look different. A recipe for greatest success includes a large helping of grace. Simply because individuals have different ways of operating or diverse preferences from ‘the way we have always done it,’ does not mean it is wrong.

The greatest legacy we can provide is to make and multiply disciples. Similarly, our contribution to church legacy may be measured by (1) how well we encourage others to participate, (2) how well we equip them to lead, and (3) how well we take our hands off and empower them to take us to new ministry frontiers.

If you are a teacher, deacon, committee member, greeter, or serve in any other capacity ask yourself this question: “If you were not doing what you are doing, who would do it?”

If you cannot immediately answer that question, you need to be searching for someone to encourage, equip, and empower.

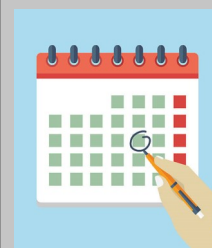
