Have you ever shared a struggle with someone and received this response: “I will be praying for you?” Have you said these words to someone else? It is easy to say this, but often difficult to know where to start, especially if you haven’t personally walked in their shoes. And when we ask them HOW we can pray, sometimes they don’t even know. Romans 8:26-27 is one of the most encouraging verses for us concerning prayer.

“In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God’s people in accordance with the will of God.”

In addition to this comforting truth from Romans, the book of Psalms is a great place to start as well!



*“You, God, are my God,
I earnestly seek you;
I thirst for you,
My whole being longs for you,
In a dry and parched land
Where there is no water.
I have seen you in the sanctuary
And beheld your power and your glory.
Because your love is better than life,
My lips will glorify you.

The book of Psalms contains words of praise, worship, prayer and despair for every situation. If a friend is struggling with sin, pray Psalm 32 for them. If a friend or family member is suffering from a broken heart or depression, pray Psalm 147 and Psalm 42. It can be as simple as saying, “Dear Lord, please be with....” Then read through the Psalm as part of your prayer. Lift up your praise and requests using the words that He has already given us.

Praying for the Coach

The prayer list of the coach's wife can be quite lengthy.

Besides immediate family and friends, there are athletes, the coaching staff, community members and often players' parents that need to be added to that list!

To encourage us in praying for our husbands, we've asked a coach for some specific prayer requests that apply to both the personal and professional life in the world of sports.

The coaching profession provides incredible opportunities for authentic ministry and life influence. Billy Graham once affirmed that “a coach will impact more people in one year than the average person will in an entire lifetime.” Although the importance of Godly coaches is immeasurable, it is reasonable to acknowledge a few of the increased demands and unique challenges that accompany the profession in today’s world. The expectations to win quickly, consistently, and convincingly are growing yearly.

As a result of this pressure, many coaches are asked to work longer hours and spend more time away from their own families. In addition, social media platforms have resulted in more public, personal, and inflammatory criticism. It has become virtually impossible to protect families from many baseless and harmful opinions. Another factor is that many athletes and parents are becoming less patient with the traditional developmental process and are more focused only with the end result. This has led to increased transfers, parental involvement, emphasis on the next level, and adjustments to coaching methods. As you pray for coaches on the front lines today, here are a few tangible requests...

1. That coaches would remember that their significance is in Christ Alone
 - NOT in a win-loss record
2. That coaches would find JOY in the daily coaching journey
3. That coaches would use their unique gifts and circumstances in a way that would honor and glorify the Lord
4. That coaches would be intentional about protecting their marriage and families

Wes had a double header tonight and called sometime after 10 to let me know he was finishing up. And to also remind me he was headed to Walmart to get some Oxi Clean. I'd be lying if I said this errand didn't annoy my flesh a little. After putting two of our boys to bed and still wrestling the one who hates sleep, I was frustrated that this trip was going to postpone his already late arrival.

Fast forward- it's now almost 2am and I can hear him in the laundry room tirelessly scrubbing every slide and dive out of those white uniforms, reliving every close call, contemplating the "what would have been" go ahead run, and wondering what he could have done differently to secure the win.

The season is a challenging one for our family, and if I'm being transparent, for our marriage. Long days, and even longer nights. And let's be real, I don't always handle the chaos of our life gracefully. He misses dinner. A lot. Sometimes the only conversation we have is the one we grab before and between games. And his absence is felt deeply during the before bed snuggles with our three boys (not to mention he's gone again before the sun ever rises).

Being a coach is essentially living your life in the hot seat. The hard reality is that sometimes every decision and call you make is placed up for judgment and debate.

But after being with a coach for 17 years, I've had the opportunity to be a spectator. I've been able to enjoy seeing the lives influenced positively by what he so proudly does. I've watched players be successful on and off the field, simply by being empowered by someone

cheering them on. I've read the letters from past players, thankful for not giving up on them when they were kind of a brat. And we even prayerfully had the chance to invite a player to live several years with us, becoming our "son."

So every year, I come to this place where I realize the things that sometimes drive me nuts are the qualities I love most about him. He's stubborn and over-the-top. He's passionate and loyal. If you know Wes, you know he's "extra" (in a good way). But find me a player that played for him previously, and I guarantee you he never doubted that Wes pushed him to be successful on and off the field.

I write all this to say, when you see those crisp, clean, white uniforms, I hope you smell the Spray N' Wash for miles. Because I know (and love) the man who stayed up all hours so that his boys looked good when they took the field for the next game. And my momma heart hopes that my boys play for a coach who loves them enough to not only mentor and guide them in the game, but to proudly pray over their lives relentlessly.

So if you're a baseball wife, I'm praying for you. Maybe you're having a great week and feel like you're hitting some homeruns in all things life. Or maybe you're up to bat, bottom of the 7th, two outs, full count and you'd rather the pitcher just hit you with that pitch.

You, as a wife, are part of the story God is so beautifully crafting for your husband and his players. So keep on keepin' on during this season.

#Blessed Life

“Blessed are those who keep his testimonies, who seek him with their whole hearts.” Psalm 119:1

READ: Psalm 119:1-16

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: When things don't go as planned in your family's coaching journey, ask the Lord to help you praise Him even through your disappointments. Find a time and place to listen to worship music, read the Word and pray. In this way, we often find that knowing Jesus is the greatest blessing.

Serious about Sin

“Put false ways far from me and graciously teach me your law!” Psalm 119:29

READ: Psalm 119:17-32

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: Just as we cry out to God in our disappointment, we can be honest with Him about our sin. He sees it all anyway and He is ready to forgive. Confession is part of worship, so as we praise Him and focus on His holiness, our sin will become even more apparent and we can be intentional about asking for His forgiveness.

A Cry for Wisdom

“Give me understanding, that I may keep your law and observe it with my whole heart.” Psalm 119:34

READ: Psalm 119:33-48

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: It is estimated that adults make over 35,000 decisions per day. We need God’s wisdom! We don’t ask for His direction to confirm our plans, but rather to guide us according to His will. Make a list of every decision that is weighing on your heart and mind. It could be a decision about what to cook for dinner or a decision about a coaching job opportunity. Take your list to God in prayer. You may not get all the answers right away, but His peace will guard your heart and mind in Christ Jesus! (Read Philippians 4:6-7)

Suffering Well

“I am a companion of all who fear you, of those who keep your precepts.” Psalm 119:63

READ: Psalm 119:49-64

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: We know in our minds that in this world we will suffer, and that the Lord wants to comfort us. However, the beauty of community is that we get to remind each other of these truths at a heart level. It is a blessing when your husband is part of an amazing coaching staff, and you can have fellowship and community right there together. However, you may not be in that type of situation, but you need other believers just the same. Take a moment to think through some of the women you have met in your area, even if you have just moved into town and even if you might be moving again after the season. Find at least one woman you are like-minded with, and ask the Lord to build a friendship. And, if you are too tired to reach out to someone, ask the Lord to bring them to you!

Spiritual Surgery

“It was good for me to be afflicted, that I might learn Your statutes...

If your law had not been my delight, I would have perished in my affliction.”

Psalm 119:71 & 92

READ: Psalm 119:65-96

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: Coaches don't send their athletes into the games without preparation. Training comes first. Game time is NOT the time to start lifting weights, hoping to survive without injury. The same is true in the trials we face. The moment of crisis is NOT the time to start getting in God's Word. Through time alone with the Lord, we are trained in righteousness. If you don't already do this, commit to spending time daily reading the Bible. You don't need a big reading plan or schedule, just open the Word, and just do it!

Full Hearts

“Your testimonies are my heritage forever, for they are the joy of my heart.” Psalm 119:111

READ: Psalm 119:97-120

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: Do we really LOVE God's Word? Yes, it is helpful. Yes, it is encouraging. But when there is a job loss, conflict with school administrators or slander surrounding the program- can we honestly say that our hearts are full of joy? Scripture memory is a great way to keep check on the posture of our hearts. Commit the verse above (Psalm 119:111), or another verse that you can call to mind in the midst of conflict or anger.

Called to Compassion

“My eyes long for your salvation and for the fulfillment of your righteous promise.” Psalm 119:123

READ: Psalm 119:121-136

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: We often say that “coaching is a calling.” There are so many needs on the mission field of sports, and just helping players in practical ways requires so much time and energy. However, this passage from Psalm 119 reminds us that we aren’t just called to serve, we are called to cry out in compassion for the sake of the hurting players, parents, schools and communities. “My eyes shed streams of tears because people do not keep your law.” Psalm 119:136 This is a great heart-check for us all. Are we fighting the system to have successful seasons, or are we walking in compassion for the brokenhearted, regardless of the scoreboard?

Brokenness

“I rise before dawn and cry for help; I hope in your words.” Psalm 119:147

READ:Psalm 119:137-152

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: It’s often hard to ask for help, especially as a coaching family. There are a lot of expectations, and the need to “have it all together” can put a lot of pressure on the coach and his wife. You might be putting all kinds of pressure on yourself! However, we learn from this passage that there is no shame in being broken, honest and desperate before God- in fact, it is beautiful. In this world, we will never get to a place of self-reliance. A great exercise is to make a list: I can’t.....but Lord, You can.....

Opposition

“Many are my persecutors and my adversaries, but I do not swerve from your testimonies.” Psalm 119:157

READ: Psalm 119:153-168

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: There is a very good chance that your husband has experienced criticism at some point and in some way during his career. Maybe a parent in the stands, or maybe on social media, but it is a challenge regardless. So here is another challenge: Pray for your “enemies.” They might be going through something and taking it out on others, or they might just be unkind, but ask God to help them and to change your heart as well.

Mindset

“Let my soul live and praise you, and let your rules help me.” Psalm 119:175

READ: Psalm 119:169-176

HOW DID GOD ENCOURAGE YOU THIS WEEK THROUGH THE SCRIPTURE OR VIDEO?

Suggestion for Application: In the final verse of Psalm 119, we find David in a place of humility, maybe even more so than in verse 1. “I have gone astray like a lost sheep; seek your servant...” Psalm 119:176 David has clarity about his sin, the hope that’s found in the Lord and the mindset of living a life of praise and obedience. As we close out this study, we encourage you to find at least one verse out of the chapter that captures what the Lord has done in your heart these last weeks. For example, do you first describe God’s Word as your lamp and your light, or your delight or your hope in affliction- or all of the above? Or, has He shown you sin that you need to confess? Find the verse(s) that you can hold onto going forward.

If you have been a part of the Coaches' Wives Ministry from the start, you understand the journey we've been on over the past few years. When it all began, we didn't have a magazine or an app! We had original videos and books, zoom studies, a RightNow Media video library, leadership training, and a private group for members. The membership dues were \$12 a month for an all-access pass to the content and community, and the membership fees funded all the activities. We finally received full non-profit status in June of 2021, and with that, the door opened to make some significant changes. We removed membership costs to remove the financial barrier and our members have been able to invite their fellow coaches' wives to join. In this way, we have been able to expand in our values of Growth through Discipleship, and more women growing in God's Word and hearing the Gospel of Grace. However, these changes have also required us to find new ways to fund the ministry, and we invite you to join us in this endeavor.

Infertility, Loss, & Mother's Day

Mother's Day is always portrayed as this joyous day full of sunshine, flowers, and the color pink. You go to church, take a family picture, eat dinner together, and hug your mama a few extra times. However, truthfully, it can be really hard for some of the women in your life. Ladies whose hearts are aching so deeply to be a mother. Ladies who would give anything to have a baby in their arms; they are walking through infertility or waiting on an adoption placement. Ladies who are mourning their motherhood; they have had a miscarriage, a stillbirth, or lost a child. Ladies who know they will never be a mother; they have either chosen that path or been dealt that truth.

I remember before my daughter was born, a couple of Mother's Days came and went while we were trying so desperately to get pregnant. It was hard. And, through our secondary infertility battle, we lost the only baby we have been able to conceive in two years. Even now that I have a beautiful child to call me "Mama" on Mother's Day, it still serves as a reminder of the one that I never got to hold in my arms. I should be a mom to two little loves right now. And, that's a heartbreaking feeling. If you are walking through infertility or loss, Mother's Day is often a brutal reminder of what you don't have in front of you. And I am so so sorry for your pain, friend.

So what do we do when we don't know what to do? When you are walking through this journey, how do you hold onto hope? Or, if you know someone near to you fighting this battle, what can you do or say to help? PRAY. Prayer is how I fight my battles. Prayer is powerful. It is an intimate, honest conversation between

you and the God of the Universe! The One who is able to do ANYTHING! I have been in many seasons where I so desperately needed to not only be in prayer myself, but to know that I had prayer warriors calling out to our Heavenly Father on my behalf. And, because I know what it's like to need that support, I know how important it is to reciprocate it, as well.

When I say I am praying for you, I mean it. Often people say flippantly, "Praying for you," but then they just as quickly forget to actually do it. I have been very guilty of this in the past, and because of that conviction, I began the purposeful practice of writing down names on my bathroom mirror. If I am not intentional in reminding myself of these people, I will forget. And I never want to forget the most important thing that I could do for those who are hurting.

"We always thank God for all of you and continually mention you in our prayers." -1 Thessalonians 1:2

So we pray, because that's the only thing that we truly have the power to do in these humanly powerless situations. Through faith, we can approach God with freedom and confidence (Ephesians 3:12). Letting someone know that you are specifically praying for them is a simple reminder that they are seen, loved, and being lifted up to the all-powerful King of Kings. There is nothing that could mean more.

Here are some specific Psalms that you can use to pray over these hurting hearts as Mother's Day approaches...



Pray that the Lord will hear their cries as they seek Him.

Psalm 27:7-8

Pray for closeness with the Lord in their sorrow and pain.

Psalm 30:5, Psalm 34:18, Psalm 147:3, Psalm 126:5

Pray that they would truly know God as their helper and deliverer. Psalm 30:2, Psalm 34:4

Pray that they would find hope in the waiting.

Psalm 33:20-22, Psalm 27:13

Pray that God would strengthen them as they trust Him.

Psalm 31:24, Psalm 143:8

Praise God that He is already there with them and in control of it all. Psalm 28:6-7, Psalm 31:7, Psalm 116:1-9
