LIZ'S UPDATE

ADULT DISCIPLESHIP & WORSHIP

As I mentioned on Sunday morning, we have a big event coming up on April 12. That day, we'll be hosting the Seek Conference. This is an all-day event that will include a ton of worship, which I'll be leading along with our worship band, teaching, prayer, fellowship, and time to engage with what we've been learning that day. Lunch will be provided for everyone as well as nursery care for the youngest. Heather will be leading the kindergarten through 5th Graders that day in activities that will go along with what the rest of us will be experiencing. I have been thinking recently about the power of the hand-written word.

When I started college in the fall of 1992, we had no cell phones, no internet, and no cheap way to communicate with people in other towns. (The internet was launched my sophomore year!) Sometimes, I think our ability to communicate with one another as easily as we do today has actually not been a good thing, but that's an article for another time. 😊 My freshman year, my sweet mom wrote a letter to me every single week. She always wrote it on Monday after lunch while she was working in her beauty shop, and she would drop it in the mail either Monday night or Tuesday morning. Her letter would arrive in my campus mailbox either Wednesday or Thursday, and boy was it a breath of fresh air. I missed home terribly my freshman year of college, and having those words from my mom every week made those hard days bearable.

She continued this letter writing practice during my entire 4 years at college. Every single week Mom sent me a letter. I saved every letter she wrote and had them in my possession for several years after I graduated from college. In my life, I'm definitely a "thrower" not a "saver." I've thrown away (or donated) many things in my life, and I have never regretted it. Well, there's one thing I regret throwing away. Can you see where this is going? When I moved back to Sioux Falls to go to seminary, I decided I needed to go through my belongings and get rid of things that I probably didn't need. For some reason, I decided to not to keep all those letters my mom had sent. There were 4 years' worth of weekly letters, and I had them in big manilla envelopes. They were bulky and took up a lot of space. In my 20s, I just could not foresee a day when I'd want to go back and reread those weekly letters. So, I decided to keep the very last college letter my mom had written me and threw the rest away. Ugh. Even now I kick myself that I did that. It's literally the only thing I ever regret having thrown away.



I'm so thankful for that last letter I saved, and I do have a few other things my mom wrote to me. And now that she's no longer with us, I find those words to be such a treasure to me. Here's where I want to go with this.

Friends, in today's world, we text. We email. We send social media messages. All things that will not stand the test of time. When was the last time you wrote words on paper and gave them to someone you cared about? I'm here to tell you that the written word matters. Things we write and share with those we care about can have far lasting impacts that we could never imagine. I encourage you, if there's someone in your life to whom you owe a debt of gratitude, a word of encouragement, or simply a greeting with a short note about how you're going, then grab a pen and some paper and WRITE it out and send it. You have no idea how much good it will do your soul or how much it might impact them. I don't care if your handwriting is good or not. Just do it. In a time where the written word is seriously becoming extinct, I think we would do well to revive it. You might be surprised at the blessing in it.

Anyway, that's a little food for thought on this warm February day. 😊
