This week's meeting at 10:10am for our annual review of last year's finances and the new budget, is all set in place. As I have mentioned before, a lot of hard work has gone into all this each year. I want to take some time this week and share some extra thoughts from this past Sunday. When we are talking about "born again" ideas or when we are talking about "asking Jesus into your heart", what are we really saying? What I would like for us to consider is making sure, in your own hearts, that you have made that commitment to trust Jesus with your life. It is a decision we all must make in our lives. We don't take on the faith of our parents or our church, we must discover that for ourselves. There are steps to becoming disciples of Jesus, and that first step is a big one. When Jesus chose the first disciples, he would go to them and ask them to drop what they were doing, and follow him. He asked them to trust that he was worth that kind of decision. "Follow me" meant believing that Jesus could do for them what they could never do on their own. It meant that whatever plans they had would be nothing in comparison to what he had in store for them. He was asking them to join him in this new Kingdom. If this is something you struggle with, let me share with you this thought. Find a place and time this week that you can be alone with God. If it doesn't work this week, then do it next week, but make a commitment to have this time with God. Consider your life and where it has gone. Consider the things that get you down and yes, even the things that fill you. For the things that fill you, give God a word of thanks for those. For all of us there will be things we know we should not have done. For those things, ask God to forgive you. Tell him you are sorry. Believe in your heart that Jesus died for those. Do you believe that? Ask God to bring his presence into your life. Ask Jesus to take your life and began to work a "way" into your days. Commit at a new level to seek his face. You must mean it with all your heart...then...tell someone you are doing this new thing. Tell me if you want, but tell someone. Remember friends, this is journey. It isn't over at that point; it is just starting. You may notice a change in somethings right away, or you may not notice much at all, but if you keep searching, trust me, things will begin to change in your hearts. God will keep his word to you. Jesus didn't go to the cross of for nothing; God didn't raise him from the dead for nothing; that was for you. Take a hold of that promise and live in the power of that promise. It is so worth the journey. Be honest with yourself and be honest with God. Tell him you are going to trust him for your salvation! Amen!

CURT'S MISSION TRIP TO GUATEMALA

LEAVING ON MARCH 15

In 1981, Steve Miller was an ordinary guy with an ordinary name. He didn't have a burning desire to do mission work and he certainly didn't have a burning desire to go to Guatemala at the height of a civil war, but he accepted an invitation to tour the war torn country.

What Steve didn't know was that God had already put many the pieces of the puzzle in place that would one day be Helps International. A missionary named Paul Townsend was his tour guide in Guatemala and what he showed Steve changed the course of his life. Steve knew he had to do something, but where does one even start? Clothes? Housing? Medical care? Dental care? The needs were overwhelming.

At some point, Steve asked his dentist if he'd be interested in going to Guatemala. His dentist said yes!...another piece of the puzzle. His college buddy was a successful plastic surgeon in St. Cloud, MN...and he had a business partner...and he knew some people...and so on and so on...the puzzle began to take shape.

In 2000, the medical team was seeing a lot of burn victims, many were children, and lung ailments from cooking over open fires and leaky wood burning stoves. Steve's brother in law happened to be an engineer who designed the ONIL stove...another piece of the puzzle.

On March 15, I'll be leaving for Guatemala on my 3rd trip as a member of the stoves team. We will install 150 stoves over the course of our 10 day stay. Over 300,000 ONIL stoves have been installed in Guatemala and burn victims are a rarity now.

What do we need from you? This puzzle wasn't put together without a lot of prayer.

Pray for our safety. The work is hard and trekking up and down the mountainsides carrying tools, Bibles, water, etc. doesn't come without the risk of injury. We have an armed military escort with us wherever we go. There's a reason for that.

Pray for our health. We take every precaution not to ingest the things that will send our unconditioned digestive systems into a tailspin, but, as I found out last year, it still happens...and it's not fun!

A final word of thanks to the support from Community Reformed and a reminder that we are all pieces of Gods magnificent puzzle.

Summer seems so far away and as I write this, the weather is getting as close to opposite of that as well! However, we are looking ahead some right now as our registration for the summer mission trip is open for the high school youth group. Our group is heading to Waco, Texas for a week of serving the community there. While Waco has a few fun things it is known for, it also has a high poverty rate, and there are a lot of children in that as well. Some of what we do will be serving alongside those in that setting. This semester our Sunday School time will be a little different. We will be going through the book of John and his writing. In chapter 20, he talks about how he wrote these things down so that we would believe Jesus is who he says he is and that through belief, we would have life. As we explore John's gospel, we focus on the identity of Jesus, his teaching and signs, and his death and resurrection. We do so with John's desire in mind – that we might have life in Him.

For Wednesday nights, we are sticking with the theme of life as we do a three part series on "New Life in Christ". We explore our new identity, our new purpose and our new hope. I have a couple of volunteer opportunities for your consideration:

- 1. Community's School Team will have a table at an event on February 6. It is a chili cookoff and community fair where different organizations share information with students and families as they walk around tasting chili. Our theme for the table that our church is hosting will be "Community and Ben Reifel- we go together like chili and cinnamon rolls." The rain sticks come in boxes of 12 and I'm hoping we can pre-assemble at least 10 boxes.
