ADULT DISCIPLESHIP & WORSHIP



We have a new adult class on the horizon that I'm excited to share with you. Jon Harmsen is going to be offering a class on the foundations and basics of Christian faith. He'll be teaching this class on Sunday mornings and is hoping to get started February 9. He plans to run through late spring. The class is open to anyone who wants to learn more about the foundations of Christian faith.

Mid-Week is in full swing, and our numbers have stayed high! It's awesome to see so many adults and kids coming together in the middle of the week to grow in their relationships with Christ and each other. Remember, it's never too late to come to Mid-Week, so if you've been thinking about giving it a try, just come!

Recently, I've had a few people ask me what Study Bibles are good for adults, so I thought it might be good to share a bit of info on that in my article. There are many different Study Bibles out there, and honestly, you can find Study Bibles that focus on almost any topic that interests you. There are a few things to keep in mind when looking for a good Study Bible.

First of all, pay attention to the publisher. Anyone can self-publish almost any document these days, so you want to look for a trustworthy publishing company. Zondervan, Intervarsity Press, Nav Press, and Tyndale House are some of my favorites. If you purchase a Study Bible from any of these publishers, you can know the information will be accurate, scholarly, and true.

Secondly, look for reputable sellers. If a Study Bible is available on a larger website like christianbook.com or a well-known and trusted bookstore like our local Crossroads, you can be quite certain that it has been edited and studied by scholars who can be trusted. These places typically do not offer "fringe" literature. Their inventory usually includes books that are accepted by most in Christendom. You will want to avoid buying books from unknown sellers or authors because again, anyone can publish anything, and you might end up with something very far from the truth.

And lastly, because of the sheer volume of study Bibles available, you want to look for a study Bible that includes the things you find interesting. Do you like maps? Word studies? Concordances? A glossary? Character studies? Essays? Then look for those particular things in the study Bibles you test out. As I said at the start, there are many different kinds of study Bibles. So, keep looking until you find the one that has the study materials you want.

And for what it's worth, I have 2 favorite study Bibles. The first one is an NIV Life Application Study Bible published by Zondervan. I got it for my 20th birthday, and it continues to help me grow. I still read it daily. This Bible has a ton of different learning aids too: character studies, timelines, maps, Bible dictionary, and commentary on many verses. It's a sizeable Bible, but it's been wonderful. And the second Study Bible is one I just picked up this past year. It's the NRSV Renovare Study Bible, published by HarperOne (also a great publisher). It includes several essays (historical, theological, eschatological, etc.) and documents written by some of the finest Biblical scholars of our time including Dallas Willard, Richard Foster, Eugene Peterson, and Walter Brueggemann. If you're looking for a bit of challenge and depth in your next Biblical study, this could be a good option. So far, I've learned a ton from what's included in this Bible, and I've deeply appreciated the scholarly nature of the "study" part of this Study Bible.

If you've been thinking about investing in a study Bible, I hope this gives you a place to start. And as always, if you have questions, please don't hesitate to ask!
