# HEATHER'S UPDATE KID'S MINISTRY

Happy New Year!

I hope students were able to enjoy their breaks and that getting back into the rhythm of school goes smooth for them! I know there are tests and end of semester things this week for some of our students so am praying that all goes well for them.

I am really looking forward to the start of this year as we begin our three month series on relationships. January will be a series on "Our relational God". I think we can all fall into a trap of going through the motions in seasons of life. This month, we dive into how God has continued to be with us and how we can have a relationship with Him. We will talk about some practical ways to engage with Him while emphasizing living in the freedom of the Spirit and not in the law. I love the way Dallas Willard puts it - "Grace is not opposed to effort, it is opposed to earning" This month we look at responding to the grace that God has given us.

On Sunday mornings, we will be focusing on some spiritual disciplines over the next 4-6 weeks. It will be a great way of walking alongside what we are doing Wednesday nights and is focused on seeking the kingdom here. Our God is with us. Both the middle and high school groups will start in their regular rooms before coming together the last 10 -15 minutes to walk through things together. It will be a little bit of a change, but again, I am really looking forward to the start of the year!

Hi Community!

This week, I want to highlight our sermon notes. They are located at the back of the worship space, by the offering baskets. If you have children who are still learning to participate in the worship service, this is a tool that might be useful. We designed them to work for a wide range of ages, essentially from early readers through elementary school, to youth, and adults. Each of those ages will use them differently and with greater learning and depth, but the questions and areas give space that anyone could use to arrange their thoughts. I know there are quite a few adults who use them as well.

If you are introducing your kids to the sermon notes tool or encouraging them to give it a try, I suggest telling them to look at all of the boxes on the paper before the service starts, then add their notes to any box they want as they listen and participate. It isn't like a worksheet where they would start at the beginning and fill every box in order. It is more likely they will write and draw as they listen and worship. Then, on the drive home from church, or over a meal, you can use the notes to talk about what you all experienced on Sunday morning. If you or your kids have tried the sermon notes and have feedback or suggestions, I'd love to hear from you.

# ADULT DISCIPLESHIP & WORSHIP



Happy New Year! I hope this year finds you challenged in good ways, strengthened in surprising ways, encouraged in unusual ways, and growing in God's ways. And friends, we won't notice any of those things unless we're looking for them. So, keep your eyes open for all the ways God might be choosing to move in your world.

As I mentioned on Sunday, Mid-Week gets its start again this Wednesday, January 7. If you've been thinking about trying Mid-Week, now is a perfect time to start. We will be having tacos this week, a fan favorite. 😊 Supper will be served from 5:30 to about 6:15. If that sounds good to you, just show up.

Remember, we have something for everyone at Mid-Week when it comes to lessons and learning opportunities. All of these start at 6:30 and finish by 7:30. Here is a rundown of every opportunity.

- Teresa and Larrisa work with our youngest kids in the nursery, infant to preschool age.
- Heather and her team have learning and fun for kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> Grade.
- Doyle and his team do Middle School youth group from 6:30-7:30pm. High School Youth group starts at 7:30.
- And then we have 7 different adult classes available for any interested adults.
  - Pastor Clyde will be doing a class called "I'm Saved. Now What?" This class will lead you into what your life can look like after you've made a decision to follow Christ. Normally, we think making the decision is the goal, but that's only the beginning.
  - Pastor John T. will continue his class called "The Wired Word." In this class, students look at present day events through the eyes of Scripture.
  - Pastor Liz (me!) will be leading a class on Spiritual Gifts. In this class we will focus on what the spiritual gifts are, define and understand each gift listed in Scripture, and learn how we can use them appropriately to encourage one another and build the Kingdom of God. We'll also take a Spiritual Gifts Inventory before the end of the semester.
  - John Blok will be leading a group for men called "Men's Life." This group focuses on what it's like to be a man of Christ in today's world. Discussions center on learning how to involve God in your everyday life of work, marriage, fatherhood, friendship, etc.
  - Abbie Coffey will be doing a repeat of her fall semester class, "Followship." So, if you wanted to take that class in the fall, but ended up taking another class, you have a 2<sup>nd</sup> opportunity to take this class this spring!
  - Grace Collins will be leading her women's group called "The Flower Patch." These classes focus on involving God in our everyday lives and learning to see Him in every situation we encounter.
  - Ross Larson will be offering a class called "A healthy Life. This class is a series of Biblical discussions about topics for healthy life in Christ. Lessons will focus on learning about Christ-centered health in multiple areas such as financial, spiritual, personal, and relational health.

As you can see, we have some fantastic options for adult learning on Wednesday nights. I hope you'll join us!
