ADULT DISCIPLESHIP & WORSHIP



We are fully back into our regular schedules for our church activities. And I don't know about you, but I'm ready to be on a regular schedule again. 😊

Mid-Week starts back up again on Wednesday, January 8. We'll have a meal served from 5:30-6:20, and classes for all ages run from 6:30-7:30. Remember, it's never too late to give Mid-Week a try. You can jump into any class that appeals to you, and you can switch classes week to week. Below is a list of the adult classes available on Wednesday nights:

Pastor Clyde – The Scandal of the Kingdom by Dallas Willard. Clyde will teach 2 more weeks of his class on Revelation and End Times study, and then he will be transitioning to the "Scandal of the Kingdom" book. This book will discuss the parables of Jesus and how we can learn to enter into the Kingdom of God now.

I (Pastor Liz) will be starting my new study on the book "Celebration of Discipline: The Path to Spiritual Growth" by Richard Foster. We will be learning about 12 different spiritual practices (including prayer, fasting, study, solitude, service, worship, etc.) and how to practice them in ways that put us in a prime position to be transformed by the Holy Spirit. These practices have been around since before Jesus walked the earth, and they continue to be places where God consistently meets His people. If you'd like to take your practical faith to the next level, I think this class and book will help you on that path.

Pastor John Thornton will continue his Wired Word study which focuses on current events from a Biblical perspective.

Susan Bierwagen will continue her Max Lucado video study on The God of Those Who Struggle.

John Blok will continue to meet with his Men's Life Group where they tackle a variety of men's life issues.

Grace Collins will continue to meet with her Flower Patch group, which focuses on women and how their stories impact their lives.

Dan Goeller will continue his class, "Living in Babylon," which looks at the similarities of our present culture alongside ancient Biblical cultures and discusses how we can rely on God to lead us through these challenging times.

Remember that it's completely acceptable to try several different classes during Mid-Week. So, if you're ready for a change or if one of these classes looks interesting to you, please join us on Wednesday evening! Stay warm this week!

Our summer mission trip registration is officially open for high school students and their parents. This year, we will be heading down to Waco, Texas for a mission trip partnered with Youth Works. This is an organization that has been around for a long time and does a great job making connections in different communities around the US and partnering with other ministries to create a mission trip experience for students. Students and parents, if you are interested in more information, have not received my email that was sent out this week, or are having trouble with the registration side of things, please reach out anytime.

At the end of last year, I was reading a study that had been taken on reading scripture. In their research, they found a huge significance from people who read 0-3 days a week to those who read at least 4 days a week. As we start this year, we will be challenging students in both middle and high school to dig into their bibles on a consistent basis. Not because they "should" but because we can experience God's kingdom here through His word – we can experience life.

In Sunday School, we will be going through the book of John this semester. I'm excited to change things up a little and really focus in on one book of the bible together. For Wednesday nights, we will be starting with a phrase Clyde used the last Sunday of 2024 – Alive in 25. That phrase will find it's way into our monthly series throughout this semester as we dive into the word and experiences students are going through together.

HEATHER'S UPDATE KID'S MINISTRY

As Pastor Clyde mentioned on Sunday, I've been reading a book called, *The Anxious Generation: How the Great Rewiring of Childhood Is Causing an Epidemic of Mental Illness* by Jonathan Haidt. I'm only a couple of chapters in, so I can't say that I recommend or don't recommend the book yet, but I am fascinated with the premise. As someone who has been working with kids for over 30 years, I have noticed many changes in children and childhood. Some make me smile and some hurt my heart a little. I wish kids could have more opportunities for free play and exploration. My daughters are 17 and 19 now, so I can look back a little to their earlier years as well and see opportunities missed and opportunities enjoyed. Parenting looks different now that they are older, but it is still a gift and I'm still learning. It is easy to compare the upbringing of different generations and think about "simpler times" with fondness. However, I think it might be more useful for us to look at the opportunities we have to love, nurture, support, and develop the children we are blessed to spend time with right now. The book I'm reading focuses on technology, but I would propose that there are opportunities for all of us that exist in addition to less screen time and awareness of the impact of technology. For now, I'm focused on how to show kids at Community the one thing that will help them, regardless of what happens in their life and development and that's Jesus! We'll be plugging in to the One with all of the answers. If your child hasn't been able to attend Sunday School or Midweek yet, feel free to join any time. We make sure lessons and activities are engaging for kids whether they come every week or just once.

It has now been long enough since I put together the tool that I find fresh inspiration in the Bible verses. Luke 6:45 says, "A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in his heart. For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of." I'm spending some time and energy this month thinking about what my heart is full of and seeking Jesus.
