LIZ'S UPDATE

ADULT DISCIPLESHIP & WORSHIP

For my article this week, I want to share something God has been teaching me over the past months.

Most of you are probably not aware that I have dealt with pretty harsh allergies for most of my life. I'm allergic to certain pollens in the spring and fall, and I'm extremely allergic to animal dander, particularly dogs. My nose gets runny, my eyes get itchy, and don't even get me started on the sneezing! As I got older, I noticed that my voice would get hoarse from all the buildup of the reactions to the allergens...not good for a worship leader!

Four years ago, my dad (God, bless him!) suggested that I get tested for my allergies and start allergy shots. He knows a few people who have gone through the process of allergy shots, and everything improved so drastically for them that he was hoping I might see some of the same improvements.

So, in June of 2020, yes, right during the height of Covid, I started getting allergy shots. What you need to know about this process is that it's LONG! Allergy Immunotherapy takes 5 years. Yes, you read that right...FIVE YEARS! During that time, the patient (me) gets small amounts of the allergen injected about every 4 days until the patient builds up to the maximum dose of the allergen. That process alone takes several months. Then, those maximum dose shots continue once a month for a total of 5 years.

It didn't take very long before I started to notice a difference in how my body was responding to the allergens. The shots were working! I cut my antihistamine intake in half. I wasn't stuffy and sneezy all the time. And the biggest thing is that the hoarseness went away in my voice! I could hardly believe how great I felt! And as the years have ticked away, I just keep feeling better and better.

Here comes the God-learning part. I'm now down to my last year of shots. We're talking 12 more shots, and then I'm finished for good. And you know what? I'M SICK OF IT! Haha! I'm so sick of planning the best day to get the shots every month. I'm sick of making and taking time to drive to the clinic to get the shots. I'm sick of sitting in the clinic for 30 minutes after the shots to make sure I don't have a terrible reaction. I'm sick of the itchy, painful welts I get on my arms after the shots. Now that my allergies are pretty much gone, I don't have anything motivating me to keep going! At this point in the process, I just want to be done. But this is where the learning comes in.

Part of the reason the shots work is because we are retraining my body to NOT respond to the allergens. Unfortunately, that retraining takes TIME. Five years to be exact. This process takes the time it takes. And the spiritual learning is that the same is true of the good work God is doing within us. God's work is just going to take the time it takes. Even if we've been doing the process for 4 years, and it's basically done, we can't rush the last part. We must take the time it takes to allow the work to be truly and soundly finished. Good work just takes the time it takes.

I'm reminding myself of that right now. And I'll keep reminding myself every time I go in for a shot. I can't rush this. It will take the time it takes. But I know in the end, when that last shot is over, I will be SO THANKFUL I stuck it out! The results will totally be worth the time! And the same will be true of the work God is doing in you!

So, I offer that to you if you feel like God has been working on you but it's taking longer than you'd like. The good work of God will take the time it takes. You can't rush God's work any more than you can rush the baking of a cake, the growing of a child, or the changing of the seasons. Whatever God is doing in you, I encourage you to settle in, and let it take the time it takes. We'll be thankful we did! 😊 Have a great week!
